Section 29-15-3.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 17 2013, Chapter 81, Section 1) is amended to read: 18 "29-15-3.2. SILVER ALERT ADVISORY.--19 A. The department of public safety shall issue a 20 silver alert if, after review and investigation of a missing 21 person report of a person subject to the alert, the 22 department makes an independent determination that the 23 missing person is a person subject to the alert. 24 B. The department of public safety shall develop 25

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1 and implement a silver alert plan for the purpose of 2 disseminating, as rapidly as possible, information about a 3 person subject to the alert. The plan shall: (1) provide a procedure for the department 4 to notify the lead station that a silver alert has been 5 declared. The procedure shall include codes for use by the 6 department in communicating with the lead station to prevent 7 8 false alerts; (2) provide a procedure in which other state 9 and private print, radio, television or other media may alert 10 members of the public of the missing person; 11 include a procedure for notifying the (3) 12 department of information technology that a silver alert has 13 been declared. The department of information technology 14 shall immediately transmit the notification and related 15 information to all state field operations employees so that 16 they may be aware and vigilant in the course of their regular 17 activities; 18 (4) require cellular service companies to 19 implement silver alerts in accordance with the federal 20 communication commission's wireless emergency alerts 21 processes; 22 (5) include a procedure for notifying all 23 local and federal law enforcement agencies that a silver 24 alert has been declared; 25

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1	(6) provide for dissemination of information
2	about the missing person to the lead station, the department
3	of information technology and local law enforcement agencies
4	when a silver alert has been declared; and
5	(7) provide for collecting and maintaining
6	the following records regarding each silver alert issued:
7	(a) the municipality where the missing
8	person report originated;
9	(b) the age of the missing person;
10	(c) the gender of the missing person;
11	(d) the date of the missing person
12	report;
13	(e) the date the silver alert is
14	issued; and
15	(f) the date of recovery of the missing
16	person.
17	C. The department of public safety shall
18	distribute the silver alert notification plan to all local
19	law enforcement agencies and provide such training and other
20	assistance as is necessary to ensure that the plan can be
21	properly implemented.
22	D. Once a silver alert has been declared, only
23	the department of public safety may terminate the silver
