AN ACT

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL LICENSING; INCREASING THE DURATION
OF A LICENSE ISSUED TO A BARBER, HAIRSTYLIST, COSMETOLOGIST,
INSTRUCTOR, ESTHETICIAN, MANICURIST-PEDICURIST OR
ELECTROLOGIST FROM ONE TO TWO YEARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 61-17A-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws
1993, Chapter 171, Section 16, as amended) is amended to
read:

"61-17A-16. FEES.--The board may, by rule, establish
initial license and renewal fees not to exceed the following:

establishment license.	\$200
school license.	\$600
relocation of a school.	\$300
cosmetologist license.	\$100
barber license.	\$100
hairstylist license.	\$100
specialty license.	\$100
instructor license.	\$100
duplicate license.	\$50.00
temporary license.	\$25.00
administrative fee.	\$100
limited license fee.	\$100
licensure through reciprocity.	\$200

1 transcript. \$50.00
2 examinations \$100."

3 SECTION 2. Section 61-17A-20 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
4 Chapter 171, Section 20, as amended) is amended to read:

5 "61-17A-20. DURATION, RESTORATION AND RENEWAL OF
6 LICENSES.--

7 A. The original issuance and renewal of licenses
8 to practice as a barber, hairstylist, cosmetologist,
9 instructor, esthetician, manicurist-pedicurist or
10 electrologist shall be for a period of two years or less from
11 the date of issuance. If the licensee fails to renew the
12 license for the next two-year period, the license is void;
13 provided the license may be restored at any time during the
14 year following expiration upon the payment of the appropriate
15 fee and a late charge not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100)
16 as set forth by board rules. If the licensee fails to restore
17 the license within one year following its expiration, the
18 licensee may request restoration of the license pursuant to
19 rules promulgated by the board.

20 B. The original issuance and annual renewal of
21 licenses to operate an establishment or school shall be for a
22 period of twelve months or less following the issuance of the
23 license. If the licensee fails to renew the license within
24 thirty days after its expiration, the license is void, and, to
25 again obtain a license, an application, required

1 documentation, payment of the renewal fee and a late fee not
2 to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) as established by board
3 rules is required.

4 C. The board may establish a staggered system of
5 license expiration."

6 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the
7 provisions of this act is July 1, 2019. _____
