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AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES; ALLOWING ORGANIZATIONS THAT OWN OR LEASE VEHICLES THAT PRIMARILY TRANSPORT PERSONS WITH SIGNIFICANT MOBILITY LIMITATIONS TO ACQUIRE SPECIAL DISTINCTIVE REGISTRATION PLACARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 66-3-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 35, Section 36, as amended) is amended to read:

"66-3-16. DISTINCTIVE REGISTRATION PLATES--PERSONS WITH SIGNIFICANT MOBILITY LIMITATION--PARKING PLACARDS.--

A. The division shall issue distinctive registration plates for use on motor vehicles and motorcycles owned or leased by a person with a significant mobility limitation who requests a distinctive registration plate and who proves satisfactorily to the division that the person is a person with a significant mobility limitation.

B. The division shall issue a distinctive parking
placard to an organization that owns or leases a motor
vehicle that primarily transports persons with significant
mobility limitations and that requests a distinctive parking
placard. The organization, if qualified, may obtain a
distinctive parking placard for each vehicle used to
transport persons with significant mobility limitations.

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C. No fee in addition to the regular registration SB 189 Page 1 fee, if any, applicable to the motor vehicle or motorcycle shall be collected for issuance of distinctive registration plates or parking placards pursuant to this section.

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D. No person shall falsely claim to have a significant mobility limitation so as to be eligible to be issued a distinctive registration plate or a parking placard pursuant to this section when the person does not in fact have a significant mobility limitation. Upon notice and opportunity to be heard, the division may revoke and demand return of any placard when:

11 (1) it was issued in error or with false 12 information;

13 (2) the person receiving the placard is no
14 longer eligible;

15 (3) the placard is being used by ineligible 16 persons; or

17 (4) the organization to which the parking18 placard was issued no longer exists.

Ε. Upon written application to the division 19 accompanied by a medical statement by a licensed physician or 20 a physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse or 21 certified nurse-midwife working within that person's scope of 22 practice attesting to the permanent significant mobility 23 limitation, a resident of the state who has a significant 24 mobility limitation, as provided in this section, may apply 25 SB 189

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1 for and be issued no more than two parking placards for 2 display upon a motor vehicle registered to the person or 3 motor vehicle owned by another person who is transporting the person with a significant mobility limitation. The licensed 4 physician or the physician assistant, advanced practice 5 registered nurse or certified nurse-midwife working within 6 that person's scope of practice shall provide the division 7 8 all information and records necessary to issue a permanent parking placard. Once approved for use of a permanent 9 parking placard, a person with a significant mobility 10 limitation shall not be required to furnish further medical 11 information. 12

F. To obtain a distinctive parking placard
pursuant to this section, an organization shall submit to the
division:

(1) on a form approved by the division, a
signed statement by an authorized officer of the organization
affirming that the vehicle will be primarily used to
transport persons with significant mobility limitations and
that the registered vehicle is owned or leased by the
organization; and

(2) at least one contract that places the
organization under obligation to provide transportation
services to persons with significant mobility limitations.

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G. A parking placard issued pursuant to this

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1 section shall expire four years from the date it was issued. 2 Η. The division shall issue two-sided hanger-style 3 parking placards with the following characteristics: a picture of the international symbol of (1) 4 5 access; (2) a hologram to make duplication 6 difficult; 7 8 (3) an imprinted expiration date; and (4) for a placard issued to: 9 (a) a person with a significant 10 mobility limitation, a full-face photograph of the holder on 11 the inside of the placard covered by a flap; or 12 an organization, the number of the (b) 13 registration plate issued to the vehicle that is registered 14 or leased to the organization on which the placard will be 15 used. 16 I. The division shall consult with the governor's 17 commission on disability for continued issuance and format of 18 the placard. 19 J. The division may issue an identification card 20 containing a full-face photograph of the holder of the 21 registration plate or parking placard and the number of the 22 registration plate or parking placard issued to that person. 23 K. Upon written application to the division 24 accompanied by a medical statement from a licensed physician 25 SB 189 Page 4 1 or a physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse 2 or certified nurse-midwife working within that person's scope 3 of practice attesting to a temporary significant mobility limitation, a person may be issued a temporary placard for no 4 5 more than one year. The licensed physician or the physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse or certified 6 nurse-midwife working within that person's scope of practice 7 shall provide the division all information and records 8 necessary to issue a temporary placard. 9

L. Registration plates or parking placards issued to a person with a significant mobility limitation by another state or foreign jurisdiction shall be honored until the motor vehicle or motorcycle is registered or the parking placard holder establishes residency in this state.

M. A "person with a significant mobility limitation" means a person who:

17 (1) cannot walk one hundred feet without
18 stopping to rest;

19 (2) cannot walk without the use of a brace,
20 cane or crutch or without assistance from another person, a
21 prosthetic device, a wheelchair or other assistive device;

(3) is restricted by lung disease to such an
extent that the person's forced respiratory volume, when
exhaling for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less
than one liter or the arterial oxygen tension is less than

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1	sixty millimeters on room air at rest;	
2	(4) uses portable oxygen;	
3	(5) has a severe cardiac condition; or	
4	(6) is so severely limited in the ability to	
5	walk due to an arthritic, neurologic or orthopedic condition	
6	that the person cannot ascend or descend more than ten stair	
7	steps."	
8	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the	
9	provisions of this act is July 1, 2019	
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
