10	SECTION 1. Section 9-15-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1983,	
11	Chapter 297, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:	
12	"9-15-4. DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHEDThere is created in	
13	the executive branch the "economic development department".	
14	The department shall be a cabinet department and shall	
15	consist of, but not be limited to, six divisions as follows:	
16	A. the administrative services division;	
17	B. the economic development division;	
18	C. the New Mexico film division;	
19	D. the technology enterprise division;	
20	E. the trade and Mexican affairs division; and	
21	F. the New Mexico outdoor recreation division."	
22	SECTION 2. A new section of the Economic Development	
23	Department Act is enacted to read:	
24	"NEW MEXICO OUTDOOR RECREATION DIVISIONDUTIES	
25	DIRECTOR	SCONC/SB 462 Page 1

1 The New Mexico outdoor recreation division of Α. 2 the department shall: 3 (1)increase outdoor recreation-based economic development, tourism and ecotourism in the state; 4 5 (2) recruit out-of-state-based outdoor recreation businesses to locate in New Mexico; 6 7 (3) promote stewardship and preservation of New Mexico's unique environment and cultural assets; and 8 (4) promote education about and use of 9 10 outdoor recreation assets to enhance public health. The department, the tourism department, the 11 Β. state land office, the Rio Grande trail commission, the state 12 parks division of the energy, minerals and natural resources 13 department, the department of game and fish, the cultural 14 15 affairs department, the Indian affairs department, the 16 department of health and the department of transportation shall work in conjunction with the New Mexico outdoor 17 recreation division to support the division's duties as they 18 relate to the purposes of the respective departments and 19 agencies. 20 C. For the purposes of this section: 21 "ecotourism" means a form of tourism (1)22 that involves visiting areas of ecological interest and is 23 intended as a low-impact and often small-scale alternative to 24 standard commercial tourism; and 25

1 "outdoor recreation" means a (2)2 recreational activity that occurs outdoors in a natural 3 environment, including the use of trails, the natural landscape, water or snow resources or other natural resources 4 5 in the activity." SECTION 3. A new section of the Economic Development 6 7 Department Act is enacted to read: "OUTDOOR RECREATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE -- CREATION --8 MEMBERSHIP--DUTIES.--9 10 Α. The "outdoor recreation advisory committee" is created and administratively attached to the New Mexico 11 outdoor recreation division of the department. The director 12 of the New Mexico outdoor recreation division, or the 13 director's designee, shall serve as the chair of the 14 15 committee. 16 Β. The outdoor recreation advisory committee shall be composed of no more than fifteen members appointed by the 17 director of the New Mexico outdoor recreation division. The 18 members of the committee shall include representatives of the 19 20 outdoor recreation industry, the tourism department, the cultural affairs department, the energy, minerals and natural 21 resources department, the state parks division of the energy, 22 minerals and natural resources department, the department of 23 game and fish and the Indian affairs department. 24 C. The members shall serve at the pleasure of the SCONC/SB 462 25

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director.

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D. Staff and other administrative support for the outdoor recreation advisory committee shall be provided by the administrative services division of the department.

E. Members of the outdoor recreation advisory committee are entitled to receive per diem and mileage as provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act but shall receive no other perquisite, compensation or allowance."

9 SECTION 4. A new section of the Economic Development10 Department Act is enacted to read:

"NEW MEXICO OUTDOOR RECREATION DIVISION--SPECIAL 11 PROJECTS AND OUTDOOR RECREATION INFRASTRUCTURE FUND--12 13 CREATED.--The "special projects and outdoor recreation infrastructure fund" is created in the state treasury. 14 The 15 fund consists of appropriations, gifts, grants, donations, income from investment of the fund and money otherwise 16 accruing to the fund. Money in the fund at the end of a 17 fiscal year shall not revert to any other fund. The fund 18 shall be administered by the New Mexico outdoor recreation 19 20 division, and money in the fund is appropriated to the New Mexico outdoor recreation division for special projects 21 and outdoor recreation infrastructure determined by the 22 division to be necessary to carry out the purpose of the 23 Money in the fund shall be disbursed on warrants 24 division. signed by the secretary of finance and administration 25

1 pursuant to vouchers signed by the director of the New Mexico 2 outdoor recreation division or the director's designee." 3 SECTION 5. Section 9-5B-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992, 4 Chapter 91, Section 1) is amended to read: 5 "9-5B-1. SHORT TITLE.--Chapter 9, Article 5B NMSA 1978 6 may be cited as the "New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act"." 7 SECTION 6. Section 9-5B-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992, 8 9 Chapter 91, Section 6) is amended to read: "9-5B-6. 10 COMMISSION--POWERS AND DUTIES.--Α. The commission may: 11 accept gifts, devises, grants and 12 (1) donations from others to carry out the provisions of the 13 New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act; 14 15 (2) request assistance and staff support 16 from the department; employ such personnel as necessary to 17 (3) carry out the provisions of the New Mexico Youth Conservation 18 Corps Act; 19 20 (4) delegate responsibility for the administration and implementation of conservation projects, 21 corps members' employment and supervision, project 22 coordination and other program matters; 23 (5) establish work camps and long-term 24 25 residential facilities to house corps members and their

1 supervisors; and contact potential sponsors and funding 2 (6) 3 sources for support. 4 Β. The commission shall: 5 (1)adopt rules that are necessary for the proper administration of the New Mexico Youth Conservation 6 Corps Act, including the outdoor equity grant program; 7 (2) administer and enforce the provisions of 8 the New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act and rules adopted 9 10 pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this subsection; develop and approve corps work projects, 11 (3) activities and contracts with project sponsors; 12 administer the outdoor equity grant 13 (4) 14 program; 15 (5) establish standards, procedures and 16 policies for selecting, hiring, providing compensation for and other personnel matters involving corps members and other 17 personnel; 18 (6) foster partnerships and cooperation 19 20 between the corps and New Mexico's secondary and post-secondary schools to assist corps members in obtaining 21 education and job training; and 22 hire a program manager, who shall be the 23 (7) administrative officer of the corps." 24 SECTION 7. A new section of the New Mexico Youth 25

Conservation Corps Act is enacted to read:

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"OUTDOOR EQUITY GRANT PROGRAM--CREATED--ADMINISTRATION--GRANT CRITERIA.--

The "outdoor equity grant program" is created Α. in the department to be administered by the commission.

Each fiscal year, competitive grants shall be B. awarded to applicants for the sole purpose of funding outdoor recreation programs, in whole or in part, for youth up to the age of eighteen.

C. Annually, the commission shall establish a 10 minimum and maximum number of grants available based on the 11 funding appropriated to the outdoor equity grant program fund 12 for that fiscal year. 13

D. The commission shall award grants to applicants 14 15 through a competitive process and based upon the following minimum criteria: 16

at least forty percent of the population (1) served by the applicant are low-income youth up to the age of 18 eighteen;

(2) the applicant has a well-developed, 20 written plan to engage low-income youth in outdoor recreation 21 activities; and 22

the applicant has an educational plan to (3) 23 educate youth about climate and the environment as part of 24 its outdoor recreation program. 25

1 Ε. The commission shall establish grant reporting 2 requirements that meet the general purpose of this section. 3 F. For the purposes of this section: "applicant" means a county, municipality 4 (1)5 or other political subdivision of the state, a nonprofit 6 organization or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo that applies for an outdoor equity grant; and 7 (2) "outdoor recreation" means a 8 recreational activity that occurs outdoors in a natural 9 10 environment, including the use of trails, the natural landscape, water or snow resources or other natural resources 11 in the activity." 12 SECTION 8. A new section of the New Mexico Youth 13 Conservation Corps Act is enacted to read: 14 15 "OUTDOOR EQUITY GRANT PROGRAM FUND--CREATED.--The "outdoor equity grant program fund" is 16 Α. created in the state treasury. All appropriations, gifts, 17 devises, grants and donations received shall be deposited in 18 the fund. Money in the fund is appropriated to the 19 20 commission for the purpose of carrying out the outdoor equity grant program pursuant to the provisions of the New Mexico 21 Youth Conservation Corps Act. Any money appropriated to the 22 fund or accruing to it through gifts, grants, bequests or 23 interest shall remain in the fund. Money in the fund shall 24 not revert at the end of a fiscal year. 25

1	B. The fund shall be administered by the	
2	department. Disbursements from the fund shall be made only	
3	upon warrant drawn by the secretary of finance and	
4	administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the chair of	
5	the commission or the chair's designee for the purpose of	
6	carrying out the outdoor equity grant program pursuant to the	
7	provisions of the New Mexico Youth Conservation Corps Act."
