## A MEMORIAL

HONORING "LA MARCHA DE LOS NOVIOS" AND ITS SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTION TO NEW MEXICO'S CULTURAL ENRICHMENT.

WHEREAS, "La Marcha de los Novios" ("March of the Newlyweds") is derived from grand marches with historical roots reaching back to official functions in medieval Europe; and

WHEREAS, colonists and merchants traveling up el camino real de tierra adentro brought the tradition of the grand march with them, and it developed into a distinctly New Mexico version; and

WHEREAS, for generations, "La Marcha de los Novios" has been performed in New Mexico to the accompaniment of violin, guitar and sometimes mandolin; and

WHEREAS, although "La Marcha de los Novios" is a wedding march, it has been and continues to be used throughout

New Mexico as part of various community celebrations and important public events; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico's "La Marcha de los Novios" is a story-dance about cooperation, faith in the expression of the goodness of humanity and positive resolution for the future; and

WHEREAS, "La Marcha de los Novios" is led by a couple that directs the participants through different movement

1	patterns as the dance is taking place, and, therefore, people
2	of all ages can do it without any specific training in the
3	dance; and
4	WHEREAS, a single performance of "La Marcha de los
5	Novios" can be conducted by as few as four couples or by well
6	over one hundred couples; and
7	WHEREAS, today, "La Marcha de los Novios" is performed
8	all over New Mexico to the accompaniment of contemporary
9	bands and orchestras and is used to open various civic
10	events; and
11	WHEREAS, "La Marcha de los Novios" is simply fun to do;
12	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE
13	STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state be requested to honor
14	"La Marcha de los Novios" and its significant contribution to
15	New Mexico's cultural enrichment; and
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be
17	transmitted to the governor
