SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 461 (HB461) appropriates one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) from the general fund to the Indian Affairs Department (IAD) in FY20 to provide for a summit to promote Native American women in business and to create a directory of businesses owned by Native American women. The unexpended or unencumbered balance at the end of FY20 reverts to the general fund.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$150 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY20 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the 2018 State of Women-Owned Businesses Report, from 2007 to 2018, American Indian/Alaskan Native women-owned businesses have grown at the rate of 76 percent. IAD analysis notes that, despite this growth, Native American women have limited business opportunities in New Mexico due to few women of color in mentorship and teaching roles.
