### **SUMMARY**

House Bill 486 (HB 486) appropriates \$200 thousand from the general fund to Workforce Solutions Department (WSD) to implement "affinity-based networks" to help low-income families establish economic stability.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$200 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY20 shall revert to the general fund.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

WSD provided the following:

"The bill does not define the term "affinity-based network." However, per Wikipedia, an affinity group is a "group formed around a shared interest or common goal. Affinity groups can be based on a common ideology, a shared concern for a given issue or a common activity, role, interest or skill." Currently, the Department of Workforce Solutions, along with other agencies

including the Human Services Department, already help low-income families establish economic stability. It is unclear whether the bill intends for those funded networks to include private partners.
