SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Joint Memorial 2 (HJM2) expresses support for a strengthened commitment from the Legislature toward eliminating academic achievement gaps and disparities in educational outcomes in New Mexico. HJM2 would encourage all state agencies, school districts, and local governments to work together and commit to eliminating the academic achievement gap between ethnic minority and non-minority students. HJM2 requests that copies of the memorial be transmitted to the cabinet secretary of the Public Education Department (PED), the chair of the Legislative Education Study Committee (LESC), and the executive director of the National Education Association (NEA).

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HJM2 does not contain an appropriation.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

On July 20, 2018, the 1st Judicial District Court issued an initial decision and order on the consolidated Yazzie v. New Mexico and Martinez v. New Mexico education sufficiency lawsuits, which found New Mexico's public education system failed to provide a sufficient education for at-risk, English learner (EL), Native American, and special education students. On December 20, 2018, the court issued its final findings and conclusions of law in the consolidated lawsuits. In both the initial decision and final findings, the court cited evidence highlighting areas where funding levels, financing methods, and PED oversight were deficient.
