### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 149 relates to the executive reorganization in the renaming of the Alcohol and Gaming Division to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division. The bill updates statutory references and transfers of authorities necessary to carry out the provisions of the act. If enacted, SB 149 becomes effective June 14, 2019.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fiscal implications to RLD will be minimal; envelopes, business cards, letterhead, and website will require updating. If enacted, expenses may cross fiscal years and be slightly higher in select categories than prior years.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to RLD, the name change will cause less confusion for the public by reflecting the true scope of the agency functions. Despite gaming functions being transferred to the Gaming Control Board in 2005, RLD still fields inquiries related to gaming.
