AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONTRACT FOR SERVICES TO COLLECT AND ASSESS STATEWIDE DATA PERTINENT TO BRAIN INJURY; PERFORM A STUDY OF THE ADEQUACY OF EXISTING RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN NEW MEXICO TO PEOPLE WITH ACQUIRED BRAIN INJURY; SURVEY COMPARABLE SERVICES PROVIDED IN OTHER STATES; AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION OF ADDITIONAL SERVICES IN NEW MEXICO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

A. One hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the department of health for expenditure in fiscal year 2021 to contract for services for the following purposes:

- (1) to collect and assess statewide data pertinent to brain injury;
- (2) to perform a study of the adequacy of existing resources available in New Mexico to people with acquired brain injury;
- (3) to survey comparable services provided in other states; and
- (4) to make recommendations for the development and expansion of additional services in New Mexico SPAC → and report findings and recommendations to the department of health, the legislative health and human services committee and the legislative finance committee ← SPAC.

B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2021 shall revert to the general fund.
