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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:	
12	SECTION 1. SESSION EXPENSES	
13	A. There is appropriated from the general fund for	
14	the expense of the legislative department of the state of New	
15	Mexico for the second session of the fifty-fourth legislature	
16	for per diem and mileage of its members, for salaries of	
17	employees and for other expenses of the legislature, five	
18	million four hundred ninety-four thousand seven hundred	
19	dollars (\$5,494,700) or so much thereof as may be necessary	
20	for such purposes.	
21	B. The expenditures referred to in Subsection A of	
22	this section are as follows:	
23	(1) per diem for members of the senate	
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25	(2) per diem for members of the house of	HB 1
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1 \$ 350,700; 2 (3) mileage traveled by members of the 3 senate going to and returning from the seat of government by the usually traveled route, one round trip. . . . \$ 6,650; 4 (4) mileage traveled by members of the house 5 of representatives going to and returning from the seat of 6 government by the usually traveled route, one round trip. . . 7 8 (5) salaries and employee benefits of senate 9 \$ 1,721,308; 10 (6) salaries and employee benefits of house 11 of representatives employees. . . . . . . . . \$ 1,557,300; 12 (7) for expense of the senate not itemized 13 above, three hundred ninety-five thousand seven hundred 14 twenty-two dollars (\$395,722). No part of this item may be 15 transferred to salaries or employee benefits; 16 (8) for expense of the house of 17 representatives not itemized above, four hundred four 18 thousand three hundred eighty dollars (\$404,380). No part of 19 this item may be transferred to salaries or employee 20 benefits; and 21 (9) for session expenses of the legislative 22 council service, the joint billroom and mailroom and joint 23 legislative switchboard, eight hundred thirty-seven thousand 24 six hundred dollars (\$837,600) to be disbursed upon vouchers 25

signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee.

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C. The expenditures for the senate shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief clerk's designee. The expenditures for the house of representatives shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the speaker and chief clerk of the house of representatives or the chief clerk's designee. Following adjournment of the session, expenditures authorized pursuant to Paragraphs (1) through (8) of Subsection B of this section shall be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee.

Under the printing contracts entered into for D. 14 the second session of the fifty-fourth legislature, the chair 15 of the committees' committee of the senate, subject to the 16 approval of the committee, and the speaker of the house of 17 representatives are authorized and directed to provide for 18 the printing of all bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, 19 memorials and joint memorials introduced in the senate or 20 house, the printing of the bill locator and the printing of 21 all necessary stationery required for use in the respective 22 houses. They are further directed to provide for the 23 purchase of all supplies necessary for use in the respective 24 houses within the appropriation provided. The orders for 25

printing, stationery and supplies shall be approved by the chair of the committees' committee of the senate or by the speaker of the house of representatives.

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SECTION 2. BILLS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS.--

A. For the second session of the fifty-fourth legislature, bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials 6 and joint memorials delivered to the printer shall be returned by the printer to the joint billroom within forty-8 two hours after they are ordered to be printed. The billroom personnel shall supply a complete file of bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials, joint memorials and other printed distribution materials to the following: 12

(1) upon request, one copy to each member of 13 the house of representatives and the senate; 14

upon written request, one copy to each (2) 15 county clerk, district judge, radio or television station and 16 newspaper and to the general library of each state-supported 17 institution of higher learning; and 18

(3) upon written request, one copy to each 19 state department, commission, board, institution or agency, 20 each elected state official, each incorporated municipality, 21 each district attorney, each ex-governor, each member of the 22 New Mexico congressional delegation and each school district 23 in the state. 24

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Β. Any person not listed in Subsection A of this

1 section may secure a complete file of the bills, resolutions, 2 joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials of the 3 legislature by depositing with the legislative council service the amount of four hundred dollars (\$400), which 4 deposit shall be paid to the state treasurer to the credit of 5 the legislative expense fund. Additional single copies of 6 items of legislation shall be sold for two dollars (\$2.00) 7 8 unless the director of the legislative council service shall, because of its length, assign a higher price not to exceed 9 ten cents (\$.10) per page. Copies of a daily bill locator, 10 other than those copies furnished to each member of the 11 respective houses, shall be supplied by the legislative 12 council service at a charge of one hundred thirty-five 13 dollars (\$135) for the entire session. 14

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE.--There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for fiscal year 2021, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, the following:

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not provided for in Section 1 of this act, for fiscal year 2021 unless otherwise indicated, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, the following:

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for travel expenses of legislators other than 5 Α. New Mexico legislative council members, on legislative 6 council business, for committee travel, staff and other 7 8 necessary expenses for other interim committees and for other necessary legislative expenses, one million dollars 9 (\$1,000,000); provided that the New Mexico legislative 10 council may transfer amounts from the appropriation in this 11 subsection, during the fiscal year for which appropriated, to 12 any other legislative appropriation where they may be needed; 13

B. for pre-session expenditures and for necessary 14 contracts, supplies and personnel for interim session 15 preparation, four hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$425,000);

C. for a statewide legislative intern program, forty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$47,500);

D. for dues and fees of national organizations of which the legislature is a member, three hundred fifty-one thousand six hundred dollars (\$351,600);

Ε. for the legislative information system, for fiscal years 2020 and 2021, one million two hundred sixtyfour thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,264,200); and
