2	RELATING TO TAXATION; CREATING THE NEW SOLAR MARKET
3	DEVELOPMENT INCOME TAX CREDIT.
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5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
6	SECTION 1. A new section of the Income Tax Act is
7	enacted to read:
8	"NEW SOLAR MARKET DEVELOPMENT INCOME TAX CREDIT
9	A. For taxable years prior to January 1, 2028, a
10	taxpayer who is not a dependent of another individual and
11	who, on or after March 1, 2020, purchases and installs a
12	solar thermal system or a photovoltaic system in a residence,
13	business or agricultural enterprise in New Mexico owned by
14	that taxpayer, may apply for, and the department may allow, a
15	credit against the taxpayer's tax liability imposed pursuant
16	to the Income Tax Act in an amount provided in Subsection C
17	of this section. The tax credit provided by this section may
18	be referred to as the "new solar market development income
19	tax credit".
20	B. The purpose of the new solar market development
21	income tax credit is to encourage the installation of solar
22	thermal and photovoltaic systems in residences, businesses
23	and agricultural enterprises.
24	C. The department may allow a new solar market

C. The department may allow a new solar market development income tax credit of ten percent of the purchase SB 29

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and installation costs of a solar thermal or photovoltaic system.

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D. The new solar market development income tax credit shall not exceed six thousand dollars (\$6,000) per taxpayer per taxable year. The department shall allow a tax credit only for solar thermal and photovoltaic systems certified pursuant to Subsection E of this section.

8 E. A taxpayer shall apply for certification of eligibility for the new solar market development income tax 9 credit from the energy, minerals and natural resources 10 department on forms and in the manner prescribed by that 11 department. The aggregate amount of credits that may be 12 certified as eligible in any calendar year is eight million 13 dollars (\$8,000,000). Completed applications shall be 14 considered in the order received. Applications for 15 certification received after this limitation has been met in 16 a calendar year shall not be approved. The application shall 17 include proof of purchase and installation of a solar thermal 18 or photovoltaic system, that the system meets technical 19 specifications and requirements relating to safety, code and 20 standards compliance, solar collector orientation and sun 21 exposure, minimum system sizes, system applications and lists 22 of eligible components and any additional information that 23 the energy, minerals and natural resources department may 24 require to determine eligibility for the credit. A dated 25

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certificate of eligibility shall be issued to the taxpayer providing the amount of the new solar market development income tax credit for which the taxpayer is eligible and the taxable year in which the credit may be claimed.

F. A taxpayer may claim a new solar market 5 development income tax credit for the taxable year in which 6 the taxpayer purchases and installs a solar thermal or 7 8 photovoltaic system. To receive a new solar market development income tax credit, a taxpayer shall apply to the 9 department on forms and in the manner prescribed by the 10 department within twelve months following the calendar year 11 in which the system was installed. The application shall 12 include a certification made pursuant to Subsection E of this 13 section. 14

G. That portion of a new solar market development 15 income tax credit that exceeds a taxpayer's tax liability in 16 the taxable year in which the credit is claimed may be 17 carried forward for a maximum of five consecutive taxable 18 years. 19

Married individuals filing separate returns for н. 20 a taxable year for which they could have filed a joint return may each claim only one-half of the new solar market 22 development income tax credit that would have been claimed on a joint return. 24

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I. A taxpayer may be allocated the right to claim SB 29 a new solar market development income tax credit in proportion to the taxpayer's ownership interest if the taxpayer owns an interest in a business entity that is taxed for federal income tax purposes as a partnership or limited liability company and that business entity has met all of the requirements to be eligible for the credit. The total credit claimed by all members of the partnership or limited liability company shall not exceed the allowable credit pursuant to this section.

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J. A taxpayer allowed a tax credit pursuant to this section shall report the amount of the credit to the taxation and revenue department in a manner required by that department.

K. The taxation and revenue department shall 14 compile an annual report on the new solar market development 15 income tax credit that shall include the number of taxpayers 16 approved by the department to receive the credit, the 17 aggregate amount of credits approved and any other 18 information necessary to evaluate the credit. The department 19 shall present the report to the revenue stabilization and tax 20 policy committee and the legislative finance committee with 21 an analysis of the cost of the tax credit. 22

L. As used in this section:

(1) "photovoltaic system" means an energy system that collects or absorbs sunlight for conversion into SB 29

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1	electricity; and	
2	(2) "solar thermal system" means an energy	
3	system that collects or absorbs solar energy for conversion	
4	into heat for the purposes of space heating, space cooling	
5	or water heating."	
6	SECTION 2. APPLICABILITYThe provisions of this	
7	act apply to taxable years beginning on or after	
8	January 1, 2020	SB 29
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
