SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 188 appropriates \$\$50 thousand from the general fund to the University of New Mexico Valencia Branch (UNMV) for a career development program to inform local high school students of local career opportunities, develop career-based teaching strategies and create networking opportunities between students and local employers.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$50 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2021 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to UNMV, feedback received from local employers after a 2017 summit suggested local jobs are available, however, local students are not prepared for those jobs. This appropriation would fund a project to develop a more prepared local workforce through increased contact between employers and schools and will increase awareness among students of local opportunities. UNMV states a more prepared workface could increase economic viability in Valencia County and increase the likelihood that students will remain in the county after completing their education.
