SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 210 appropriates \$100 thousand from the general fund to the Cultural Affairs Department to provide educational, historical and cultural programs at community museums and libraries in Santa Fe, San Miguel, Mora, Colfax and Union counties to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the opening of trade along the Santa Fe Trail.

There is no effective date of this bill. It is assumed that the effective date is 90 days following adjournment of the Legislature.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$100 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of 2022 shall revert to the general fund.

An estimated .1 FTE would be required to administer the funding and coordinate activities over the two year period.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Department of Cultural Affairs provided the following:

Established in 1821, the Santa Fe Trail connected Missouri to New Mexico. Funding would increase capacity for the Department of Cultural Affairs Divisions, including the New Mexico State Library, Museums, Historic Sites, and the Office of Archaeological Studies to create collaborative travelling exhibits, informational materials, and programs in commemoration of the 200th anniversary, distributed through the local museums and libraries of Santa Fe, San Miguel, Mora, Colfax and Union counties.
