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5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
6	SECTION 1. Section 22-10A-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986,
7	Chapter 33, Section 8, as amended) is amended to read:
8	"22-10A-6. EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE
9	A. The department shall require a person seeking
10	licensure or reciprocity in elementary, special, early
11	childhood or secondary education to have completed the
12	following minimum requirements in the college of arts and
13	sciences:
14	(1) nine semester hours in communication;
15	(2) six semester hours in mathematics;
16	(3) eight semester hours in laboratory
17	science;
18	(4) nine semester hours in social and
19	behavioral science; and
20	(5) nine semester hours in humanities and
21	fine arts.
22	B. In addition to the requirements specified in
23	Subsections A and C of this section, the department shall
24	require that a person seeking standard or alternative
25	elementary licensure shall have completed six hours of HB Pa
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HB 188/a Page 1 reading courses, and a person seeking standard or alternative secondary licensure shall have completed three hours of reading courses in subject matter content. The department shall establish requirements that provide a reasonable period of time to comply with the provisions of this subsection.

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6 C. Except for licensure by reciprocity, the 7 department shall require, prior to initial licensure, no less 8 than sixteen weeks of student teaching, a portion of which 9 shall occur in the first thirty credit hours taken in the 10 college of education and shall be under the direct 11 supervision of a teacher and a portion of which shall occur 12 in the student's senior year with the student teacher being 13 directly responsible for the classroom.

D. Nothing in this section shall preclude the
department from establishing or accepting equivalent
requirements for purposes of reciprocal licensure or minimum
requirements for alternative licensure.

E. Vocational teacher preparatory programs may be exempt from Subsections A through C of this section upon a determination by the department that other licensure requirements are more appropriate for vocational teacher preparatory programs.

F. Before December 31, 2021, the department shall
create a license endorsement in secondary computer science
available to all teachers who hold a valid license and

2	as determined by the department. The department shall consult	
3	with computer science education experts with experience in	
4	creating or supporting computer science endorsement pathways
