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AN ACT

RELATING TO RURAL COMMUNITIES; PROVIDING FOR A RURAL EQUITY OMBUD IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; PROVIDING POWERS AND DUTIES; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. RURAL EQUITY OMBUD--LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.--

A. The local government division of the department of finance and administration shall employ at least one "rural equity ombud", whose job it is to work on issues of concern to rural and frontier communities with:

(1) the governor's office, the legislature and all state agencies;

(2) counties and municipalities in the state;

(3) federal agencies, including the rural utilities service and the rural development agency of the United States department of agriculture, the United States department of the interior, the United States department of housing and urban development and other appropriate federal agencies; and

(4) nonprofit organizations that address issues faced by rural and frontier communities or provide

1 services to residents of those communities.

2 B. The rural equity ombud shall be employed solely
3 on the basis of education and experience.

4 C. The rural equity ombud shall:

5 (1) provide technical assistance to federal,
6 state and local governments on issues of concern for rural
7 and frontier communities;

8 (2) provide planning assistance to the state
9 and counties to ensure that concerns of residents of rural
10 and frontier communities are being addressed as part of the
11 state's or a county's planning processes in:

12 (a) health;

13 (b) human services;

14 (c) educational services;

15 (d) economic development;

16 (e) infrastructure planning, funding
17 and improvements, including water and wastewater, utilities,
18 roads and highways, broadband and other infrastructure;

19 (f) public safety;

20 (g) transportation;

21 (h) land use and land development;

22 (i) tourism;

23 (j) energy;

24 (k) natural resource management,
25 including game and fish resources;

1 (1) community development block grant
2 projects;

3 (m) state or local planning in
4 conjunction with federal agencies and funding; and

5 (n) any other planning processes that
6 affect rural and frontier communities;

7 (3) serve as an advocate for rural and
8 frontier communities and work to ensure that those
9 communities' needs are met and that residents of rural and
10 frontier communities have a voice in state and local
11 government;

12 (4) take and resolve complaints from rural
13 and frontier communities;

14 (5) provide bill analyses and provide
15 testimony to the legislature on legislation that positively
16 or negatively affects rural and frontier communities;

17 (6) make annual reports to the governor and
18 the legislature on:

19 (a) activities of the ombud, including
20 interactions with governmental agencies and the outcome of
21 those interactions;

22 (b) complaints received and resolved;

23 (c) structural barriers to providing
24 needed services to rural and frontier communities and
25 recommendations for eliminating or ameliorating those

1 barriers; and

2 (d) other information that may inform
3 executive and legislative decisions affecting rural and
4 frontier communities; and

5 (7) perform other duties as assigned by the
6 director of the local government division of the department
7 of finance and administration, the secretary of finance and
8 administration, the governor or the legislature.

9 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Ninety-five thousand dollars
10 (\$95,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the local
11 government division of the department of finance and
12 administration for expenditure in fiscal year 2022 to carry
13 out the purposes of Section 1 of this act. Any unexpended or
14 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2022
15 shall revert to the general fund. _____

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
