SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 187 requires the remaining 50 percent of distributions to the tobacco settlement permanent fund for FY22 to be distributed to the tobacco settlement program fund. The bill was endorsed by the Tobacco Settlement Revenue Oversight Committee and the Legislative Finance Committee.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill is similar to past years' legislation when the Legislature diverted the 50 percent of tobacco funds that would go to the tobacco settlement permanent fund and placed all the revenue in the tobacco settlement program fund for legislative appropriation.

Due to ongoing arbitration, the office of Attorney General, Department of Finance and Administration (DFA), and LFC staff are projecting a total of \$12 million in revenue from the tobacco Master Settlement Agreement for FY22 instead of the usual \$30 million to \$35 million.

The LFC FY22 budget recommendation would appropriate all of the projected \$12 million in revenue for programs that currently receive tobacco settlement funds while equally reducing the

programs' tobacco funds due to the overall reduced amount of tobacco revenue. The Executive FY22 budget recommendation proposes appropriating \$17 million in tobacco funds (see attached).

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The LFC FY22 budget recommendation endeavored to offset the reduced tobacco revenue with general fund when possible. However, reduced general fund revenue for FY22 limits the ability to fully supplant the reduced tobacco settlement funds. Passage of this bill will maintain tobacco funding for current programs to the greatest extend possible based on current revenue projections.
