15	SECTION 1. Section 21-21G-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988,
16	Chapter 111, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

Section 21-21G-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 15 Chapter 111, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read: 16 "21-21G-5. CONDITIONS FOR FIRST-YEAR ELIGIBILITY.--17 Priority will be given to New Mexico students [from those 18 groups with the most severe underrepresentation and students] 19 with the greatest financial need and students from those groups 20 underrepresented in graduate education. A scholarship may be 21 awarded to an individual who: 22 [is a citizen of the United States or who has a Α. 23 permanent resident visa] has earned a bachelor's degree from an 24 eligible institution and maintained a grade point average of 25 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale;

Section 21-21G-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 16 Chapter 111, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read: 17 "21-21G-6. CONDITIONS FOR CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY .--18 A. Except as provided in Subsection B of this 19 section, a scholarship may be reawarded to a student who: 20 [A.] (1) has been an award recipient of a New 21 Mexico graduate scholarship the previous year; 22 [B.] (2) remains in good academic standing as 23 determined by the institution and maintains a grade point 24 average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale; and 25 [C.] (3) is enrolled as a [full-time] graduate .222257.1 - 3 -

Section 21-21G-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 13 Chapter 111, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: 14 "21-21G-7. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--15 A. For award recipients who were awarded 16 scholarships prior to July 1, 2022, scholarship awards shall be bracketed material] = delete 17 for no less than seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$7,200) 18 per year to be disbursed in equal installments over the period 19 of an academic year. 20 B. Scholarship award amounts shall not exceed one 21 hundred percent of tuition and fees for the graduate or 22 professional program at the eligible institution." 23 SECTION 5. Section 21-21G-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 24 Chapter 111, Section 10, as amended) is amended to read: 25 "21-21G-10. TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--A scholarship .222257.1

1 is terminated upon the occurrence of:

A. withdrawal from the institution by the award recipient <u>or</u> failure to reenroll for consecutive academic years [or failure to be a full-time graduate student]; or

B. substantial noncompliance by the award recipient with the Graduate Scholarship Act or the rules [regulations] or procedures promulgated by the [commission] department."

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.--Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the higher education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2023 to fund the Graduate Scholarship Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2023 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2022.
