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AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL FINANCE; PROVIDING MORE FLEXIBILITY FOR USES OF FAMILY INCOME INDEX DISTRIBUTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 22-8F-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021, Chapter 18, Section 5) is amended to read:

"22-8F-5. USES OF FAMILY INCOME INDEX ALLOCATIONS. --

- Except as provided in Subsection B of this section, a public school shall use its family income index allocation [as follows] on any of the following:
- [at least one-third for] evidence-based, (1) structured literacy interventions that have been shown to improve reading and writing achievement of students;
- [at least one-third for] evidence-based (2) mathematics instruction and interventions, including .222387.1

1	educational programming intended to improve career and college

4	(3) [no more than one-third on] the following	
5	interventions:	
6	(a) case management, tutoring and after-	
7	school and summer enrichment programs that are delivered by

10	(b) culturally relevant professional and	
11	curriculum development, including those necessary to support	
12	language acquisition and bilingual and multicultural education;	
13	(c) whole school interventions,	
14	including social and emotional learning programs, [multi-	
15	layered] multilayered systems of support, student nutrition	
16	programs, school-based health centers and community schools;	
17	(d) instructional resources and	
18	materials;	
19	(e) services to engage and support	
20	parents and families in the education of students; [and]	
21	(f) services to engage and support	
22	tribal communities in the education of Native American	
23	students; and	
24	(g) services to expand or improve career	
25	technical education or work-based learning.

C.] B. A school district shall use distributions received for allowable uses specified in Subsection A of this section to expand or improve services provided as part of a public school's existing academic program, but not to replace existing services."

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
