5	WHEREAS, New Mexico has one of the highest violent crime
6	rates in the United States; and
7	WHEREAS, Albuquerque ranks in the top ten most violent
8	United States cities with a population over one hundred
9	thousand; and
10	WHEREAS, in 2014, the homicide rate for Albuquerque was
11	at its lowest, with only thirty homicides occurring that
12	year; and
13	WHEREAS, in 2021, the homicide rate for Albuquerque
14	increased by forty-six percent to the highest on record, with
15	one hundred seventeen homicides; and
16	WHEREAS, victims of violent crime feel frustrated by the
17	high number of repeat offenders; and
18	WHEREAS, the high number of repeat violent offenders
19	causes victims, their family members and the public to feel
20	unsafe; and
21	WHEREAS, victims of violent crime and their family
22	members face trauma, hardships and grief; and
23	WHEREAS, reparations to crime victims are insufficient
24	to compensate victims for their comprehensive losses; and
25	WHEREAS, victims of violent crime deserve honor and

1	access to resources;	
2	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF	
3	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that victims of	
4	violent crime and their families be honored and recognized	
5	for their loss and suffering; and	
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be	
7	transmitted to the chair of the crime victims reparation
