7	history of both New Mexico and the United States; and	
8	WHEREAS, New Mexico recognizes the importance of	
9	honoring African Americans, having enacted Section 12-5-12	
10	NMSA 1978, which states, "The second Friday of February of	
11	each year shall be set apart and be known as	
12	"African-American day"; and	
13	WHEREAS, African-American day is a celebration of the	
14	many sacrifices that African Americans have made toward the	
15	democracy everyone enjoys today; and	
16	WHEREAS, African-American day shall be observed by the	
17	people of New Mexico in recognition of those efforts; and	
18	WHEREAS, African-American day is celebrated in tandem	
19	with Black history month; and	
20	WHEREAS, the celebration of African-American day is also	
21	a time for people to reflect upon the need to diversify	
22	thinking and strategic planning to ensure that all voices are	
23	heard in decisions that affect New Mexico and New Mexicans;

honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout history; and

WHEREAS, Black history month should not be treated as though it is separate from the collective American history or as though Black history month is merely a compilation of greatest hits, ranging from the March on Washington to some of the most memorable court cases inspired by African Americans' experiences, but rather as a day that is focused on the shared experiences of all African Americans commingled into a recipe that everyone can appreciate; and

WHEREAS, the African American community in New Mexico has a compelling legacy that dates back to 1539, when Esteban, a Spanish Moor from North Africa, traveled to New Mexico seeking gold; and

WHEREAS, after the civil war, from three thousand three hundred to three thousand eight hundred African American soldiers, proudly known as the buffalo soldiers, a term given to the troops by Native Americans, were garrisoned at eleven different forts throughout the territory of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, today, New Mexico has a vibrant African American community with a population of approximately fiftyfive thousand Black people, according to the United States census bureau; and

WHEREAS, this past year has seen increased attention on police violence, systemic racism and disproportionate health

2 WHEREAS, efforts to advance racial equality and civil 3 engagement are urgent in light of recent history; and WHEREAS, everyone is encouraged to celebrate African-4 American day by honoring the contributions that African 5 Americans have made throughout history, while also 6 recognizing that the fight for racial justice and equality 7 8 continues to this day; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 9 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that February 11, 10 2022 be designated "African-American Day" in the house of 11 representatives; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be 13 transmitted to the governor, the executive director of the New 14 Mexico office on African American affairs, the board chair of 15 the African American museum and cultural center of New Mexico 16 and the president of the national association for the 17 advancement of colored people-New Mexico.______ HM 54 18 Page 3 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
