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10	A RESOLUTION
11	AMENDING THE SENATE RULES FOR ANY SESSION OF THE FIFTY-FIFTH
12	LEGISLATURE HELD IN 2022.
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14	WHEREAS, Senate Rule 24-1 provides that the rules of the
15	senate may be amended by a two-thirds' majority vote of the
16	members of the senate or by a majority vote of the members of
17	the senate upon the recommendation of the senate rules
18	committee;
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE
20	OF NEW MEXICO that the following new senate rules, for any
21	session of the fifty-fifth legislature held in 2022, be adopted
22	to read:
23	"2-4 Each senator may permit staff responsible to that
24	senator to perform assigned duties from within the
25	capitol or from a remote location; provided that a
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1 staff member required to isolate in accordance with 2 federal centers for disease control and prevention 3 guidelines shall follow those guidelines."; and 4 "7-1-1 A senator shall be considered to be present and in 5 attendance for the purposes of establishing a 6 quorum, doing business or voting during a floor 7 session if the member is physically present or participating by simultaneous, remote electronic 8 9 means, from within the capitol, as verified by the 10 sergeant at arms."; and "7-1-2 11 A senator shall be considered to be present and in 12 attendance for the purposes of establishing a quorum, doing business or voting during standing 13 14 committee meetings if the member is physically 15 present or participating by simultaneous, remote 16 electronic means and is visually present, or if 17 participating by telephone, is confirmed to be 18 present by voice, as confirmed by the committee 19 chair, whether or not the member is within the 20 capitol."; and 21 "7-1-3 A senator who is required to isolate or quarantine 22 as directed by the federal centers for disease 23 control and prevention may continue to participate 24 via simultaneous, remote electronic means from 25 outside the capitol. A senator with a medical

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condition that classifies the senator as having high risk for mortality from severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, as defined by the federal centers for disease control and prevention, may participate via simultaneous, remote electronic means from outside the capitol upon providing to the senator's respective floor leader or the president pro tempore documentation from a physician, nurse practitioner or other advanced practice medical professional licensed in New Mexico verifying the underlying condition. In the event of a call of the senate, members permitted to participate remotely from outside the capitol shall be excused from the call."; and

15 "7-19 Members of the senate, staff, employees and guests 16 shall wear face masks or respirators, as recommended 17 by the federal centers for disease control and 18 prevention, covering the mouth and nose when 19 physically present in the senate chamber, galleries, 20 lobby, senate committee rooms and rooms connected 21 therewith. Failure to do so shall constitute a 22 violation of these rules, and violators are subject 23 to disciplinary action and removal from the chamber 24 or committee room. A senator who is not compliant 25 with this rule in the senate chamber or committee

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room may participate remotely from the member's office."; and

"7-20 3 Legislators participating via simultaneous, remote 4 electronic means on the senate floor in any senate 5 standing committee shall be visually present. A 6 legislator who is not visually present when called 7 upon shall be listed as absent, unless excused. No legislator shall be logged in to a senate committee 8 9 while simultaneously logged in or present in any 10 other legislative committee meeting or floor 11 session, nor shall a senator be simultaneously 12 logged in to be present on the senate floor and in a 13 senate committee."; and

14 "9-5-9 Meetings shall be staffed by one or more hosts to 15 facilitate and allow participation by the committee 16 members, expert witnesses and the public. The 17 chair, in consultation with the ranking member, may 18 determine the duration of public comment allowed. 19 Each standing committee may also receive public 20 comment by email."; and 21 "22-3 Courtesy memorials and certificates shall not be

"23-14 The president pro tempore may set occupancy limits for any of the space occupied by senate committees and may reassign committee rooms and the senate

read aloud on the senate floor."; and

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floor as necessary to enable sufficient social 1 2 distancing for members, staff and the public."; and "24-3 3 In the event of a public health emergency while the 4 senate is in session, the senate shall adhere to health guidelines as outlined by the federal centers 5 6 for disease control and prevention and as maintained 7 on the state legislature's website for the senate when the senate is in session."; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following senate rules be 10 amended to read: 11 "7-18 Members of the senate shall dress in business attire 12 befitting the decorum of the senate and the wearing 13 of bolo ties shall be permitted, regardless of 14 whether the member is participating in person or via 15 simultaneous, remote electronic means. All persons 16 permitted access to the floor of the senate shall be 17 held to the same standard."; and 18 "9-1-2 In appointing the standing committees, the 19 committees' committee shall designate the [chairman] 20 chair, vice [chairman] chair and the ranking member 21 who shall be a member of the committee [who is not a 22 member of the chairman's political party] and who 23 does not hold a leadership position in either caucus 24 or the chamber. The ranking member of a standing 25 committee shall not be of the same political party

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1	as the chair. In designating the chair, vice chair
2	or ranking member, the committees' committee shall
3	consider [each member's seniority in the senate and
4	length of continuous service on the committee and]
5	the preference of each member's respective leader.
6	No member designated to serve as the [chairman or
7	vice chairman] <u>chair</u> of a standing committee shall
8	serve [in either position] <u>as chair</u> on any other
9	committee; provided that no vice chair of the senate
10	finance committee may be chair of another committee
11	or hold a leadership position in either caucus or
12	the chamber.".
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
