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10	A RESOLUTION
11	AMENDING THE SENATE RULES FOR ANY SESSION OF THE FIFTY-FIFTH
12	LEGISLATURE HELD IN 2022.
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14	WHEREAS, Senate Rule 24-1 provides that the rules of the
15	senate may be amended by a two-thirds' majority vote of the
16	members of the senate or by a majority vote of the members of
17	the senate upon the recommendation of the senate rules
18	committee;
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE
20	OF NEW MEXICO that the following new senate rules, for any
21	session of the fifty-fifth legislature held in 2022, be adopted
22	to read:
23	"2-4 Each senator may permit staff responsible to that
24	senator to perform assigned duties from within the
25	capitol or from a remote location; provided that a

1		staff member required to isolate in accordance with
2		federal centers for disease control and prevention
3		guidelines shall follow those guidelines."; and
4	"4-1-1	If the federal centers for disease control and
5		prevention recommends masking in public places, the
6		presiding officer shall ensure that all members,
7		staff, employees and guests who are physically
8		present in the senate chambers wear a mask that
9		covers the mouth and nose, pursuant to the
10		recommendations of the federal centers for disease
11		control and prevention, and not consume food in the
12		senate chambers."; and
13	"6-1-1	If the federal centers for disease control and
14		prevention recommends masking in public places, the
15		sergeant-at-arms shall ensure that all members,
16		staff, employees and guests who are physically
17		present in the senate gallery, senate committee
18		rooms and the senate hallways wear a mask that
19		covers the mouth and nose, pursuant to the
20		recommendations of the federal centers for disease
21		control and prevention, and not consume food in
22		those areas."; and
23	"7-1-1	A senator shall be considered to be present and in
24		attendance for the purposes of establishing a
25		quorum, doing business, satisfying a call or voting

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1 during a floor session if the member is physically 2 present or participating by simultaneous, remote 3 electronic means, from within the capitol, as 4 verified by the sergeant-at-arms. If a call is 5 satisfied, members within the capitol shall participate during the debate from the floor or the 6 7 member's capitol office and vote on the issue that is the subject of the call."; and 8 "7-1-2 9 A senator shall be considered to be present and in attendance for the purposes of establishing a 10 quorum, doing business or voting during standing 11 12 committee meetings if the member is physically present or participating by simultaneous, remote 13 electronic means and is visually present, or if 14 participating by telephone, is confirmed to be 15 present by voice, as confirmed by the committee 16 chair, from within the capitol."; and 17 "7-1-3 A senator who is required to isolate or quarantine 18 as provided by the guidance of the federal centers 19 for disease control and prevention may continue to 20 participate via simultaneous, remote electronic 21 means from outside the capitol. A senator with a 22 medical condition that classifies the senator as 23 having high risk for mortality from severe acute 24 respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, as defined by 25

1		the federal centers for disease control and
2		prevention, may participate via simultaneous, remote
3		electronic means from outside the capitol upon
4		providing to the senator's respective floor leader
5		or the president pro tempore documentation from a
6		physician, nurse practitioner or other advanced
7		practice medical professional licensed in New Mexico
8		verifying the underlying condition. In the event of
9		a call of the senate, members participating remotely
10		from outside the capitol who have not been excused
11		or necessarily prevented from being present shall be
12		considered present for the purposes of the call. If
13		a call is satisfied, members participating remotely
14		who are considered present shall participate during
15		the debate and vote on the issue that is the subject
16		of the call."; and
17	"7-19	Members of the senate, staff, employees and guests
18		shall wear face masks or respirators, as recommended
19		by the federal centers for disease control and
20		prevention, covering the mouth and nose when
21		physically present in the senate chamber, galleries,
22		lobby, senate committee rooms and rooms connected
23		therewith. Failure to do so shall constitute a
24		violation of these rules, and violators are subject
25		to disciplinary action and removal from the chamber

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1		or committee room. A senator who is not compliant
2		with this rule in the senate chamber or committee
3		room may participate remotely from the member's
4		office."; and
5	"7-20	Legislators participating via simultaneous, remote
6		electronic means on the senate floor in any senate
7		standing committee shall be visually present. A
8		legislator who is not visually present when called
9		upon shall be listed as absent, unless excused. No
10		legislator shall be logged in to a senate committee
11		while simultaneously logged in or present in any
12		other legislative committee meeting or floor
13		session, nor shall a senator be simultaneously
14		logged in to be present on the senate floor and in a
15		senate committee."; and
16	"9-5-9	Meetings shall be staffed by one or more hosts to
17		facilitate and allow participation by the committee
18		members, expert witnesses and the public. The
19		chair, in consultation with the ranking member, may
20		determine the duration of public comment allowed.
21		Each standing committee may also receive public
22		comment by email."; and
23	"22-3	Courtesy memorials and certificates shall not be
24		read aloud on the senate floor."; and
25	"23-14	The president pro tempore may set occupancy limits

1		for any of the space occupied by senate committees
2		and may reassign committee rooms and the senate
3		floor as necessary to enable sufficient social
4		distancing for members, staff and the public."; and
5	"24-3	In the event of a public health emergency while the
6		senate is in session, the senate shall adhere to
7		health guidelines as outlined by the federal centers
8		for disease control and prevention and as maintained
9		on the legislature's website for the senate when the
10		senate is in session."; and
11	BE I	I FURTHER RESOLVED that the following senate rules be
12	amended to	read:
13	"7-18	Members of the senate shall dress in business attire
14		befitting the decorum of the senate and the wearing
15		of bolo ties shall be permitted, <u>regardless of</u>
16		whether the member is participating in person or via
17		simultaneous, remote electronic means. All persons
18		permitted access to the floor of the senate shall be
19		held to the same standard."; and
20	"9-1-2	In appointing the standing committees, the
21		committees' committee shall designate the [chairman]
22		<u>chair</u> , vice [chairman] <u>chair</u> and the ranking member
23		who shall be a member of the committee [who is not a
24		member of the chairman's political party] and who
25		does not hold a leadership position <u>in either caucus</u>
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1	or the chamber. The ranking member of a standing
2	committee shall not be of the same political party
3	as the chair. In designating the chair, vice chair
4	or ranking member, the committees' committee shall
5	consider [each member's seniority in the senate and
6	length of continuous service on the committee and]
7	the preference of each member's respective leader.
8	No member designated to serve as the [chairman or
9	vice chairman] <u>chair</u> of a standing committee shall
10	serve [in either position] <u>as chair</u> on any other
11	committee; provided that no vice chair of the senate
12	finance committee may be chair of another committee
13	or hold a leadership position in either caucus or
14	the chamber.".
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
