BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis of Senate Finance Committee Amendment

The Senate Finance Committee Amendment to House Bill 130 as amended on the House Floor (HB130/aHFl/aSFC) provides that up to 60 hours of the 1,140 minimum instructional hour requirement may be used for professional work in elementary school and up to 30 hours may be used for professional work in secondary school.

Synopsis of House Floor Amendment

The House Floor Amendment to House Bill 130 (HB130/aHFl) amends the proposed K-12 Plus factor in the state equalization guarantee (SEG) to fund additional school days as follows:

- A factor of 0.012 for days between 181 and 190 (156 and 165 for four-day weeks); and
- A factor of 0.016 for days between 191 and 205 (166 and 175 for four-day weeks).

Synopsis of Original Bill

House Bill 130 (HB130) requires all schools to provide 1,140 instructional hours per year, an increase from the current minimums of 990 hours for elementary school and 1,080 hours for secondary school.

The bill defines instructional hours as an hour in a school or other location during which students receive direct instruction aligned with academic content and performance standards from a teacher or other qualified instructor, including:

- A school program;
- Enrichment programs that focus on problem-solving and cognitive skills development;
- Content that provides technical knowledge, skills, and competency-based applied learning;
- Research- or evidence-based social, emotional, or academic interventions; and
- Instruction that occurs at the same time breakfast is served or consumed in accordance with the breakfast after the bell program or federal requirements.

Up to 60 instructional hours per year may be used for professional work, which may be embedded during the course of a normal school day. Professional work which may include:

- Home visiting or parent teacher conferences;
- Educator training or professional development; and
- Mentorship, coaching, and collaboration between school employees.

The bill repeals the Extended Learning Time Program and the K-5 Plus program and creates the K-12 Plus program. Any school on a five-day school week that provides more than 180 days of instruction, and any school on a four-day school week that provides more than 155 days of instruction, will be considered a K-12 Plus school. Each K-12 Plus school will generate program units in the state equalization guarantee (SEG) equal to the school's membership times the number of additional days the school adds above 180 (or 155 for four-day calendars) times 0.012. School districts are entitled to the program units generated by each K-12 Plus school in the district.

FISCAL IMPACT

The bill does not contain an appropriation.

The House Appropriations and Finance Committee Substitute for House Bills 2 and 3 as amended by the Senate Finance Committee (HB2/HAFCS/aSFC) appropriates \$252.3 million from the general fund and \$60 million from the public education reform fund for extended learning time programs. Based on current year calendars, LESC staff estimate HB130/aHFl/aSFC will cost \$202 million and the K-12 Plus program will cost \$50.3 million; the appropriations in HB2/HAFCS/aSFC are sufficient to fund the provisions of HB130/aHFl/aSFC. If HB130/aHFl/aSFC does not pass, the appropriation will be used to fund existing extended learning time programs and K-5 plus.

The SEG does not consider the number of instructional hours in each school district and charter school's calendar, but rather distributes funding to local education agencies (LEAs) based on other factors, including enrollment, teacher qualifications, special education needs, and at-risk student characteristics. Because of this misalignment, an insufficient appropriation to the SEG could result in a number of districts being underfunded for the new minimum hour requirements, particularly those that currently participate in the Extended Learning Time and K-5 Plus programs.

All school districts will receive additional funding to increase learning time via the SEG, but some will not need to increase instructional hours, making funds available for investments in other local educational needs. LESC staff analysis of calendars for the 2022-2023 school year found school districts and charter schools often make local decisions to provide instructional hours in excess of current statutory minimums, but do so at a cost; these districts also tend to also have fewer non-instructional days, usually used for educator professional development. The LESC recommendation establishes new baseline funding for instructional hours while simultaneously providing parity for school districts that may have sacrificed teacher professional development or other interventions in lieu of learning time.

SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

Learning Time in New Mexico. While statute provides minimum requirements for instructional hours and days, local school boards and charter school governing authorities have broad authority to establish calendars. In practice, this results in 89 school districts and 100 charter schools with varying school calendars designed to meet local communities' needs. Some school districts attend school for five days per week, while others choose to attend for four days per week by participating in longer school days and additional school weeks.

LESC staff analysis of school calendars for the 2022-2023 school year found many districts already provide instructional hours in excess of the current statutory minimums. On average, elementary schools on non-extended calendars provide approximately 1,109 hours per school year, and secondary schools provide 1,141. Schools currently participating in the extended learning time program provide on average 1,186 elementary hours and 1,224 secondary hours over the course of 180 instructional days. The K-5 Plus program results in an average of 1,245 hours over the course of 184 days.


Figure 3. School Calendars: Schools with K-5 Plus Programs

According to school district and charter school calendars submitted for the 2022-2023 school year, HB130/aHFl/aSFC would require 66 of New Mexico's 89 school districts and 28 of 100 charter schools to increase their base instructional hours in either elementary school or secondary school. The extent of the new time required varies at each district and charter based on their current calendar. See Attachment 2: Summary of Impact – All Districts and Charters.

School districts and charter schools currently below 1,140 elementary hours would need to add an average of 10 days to their elementary school calendars, or 23 minutes per day to existing calendars, or some combination of days and hours. Districts and charters below 1,140 secondary hours would need to add an average of 5 days to their calendars, or 12 minutes per day to existing calendars, or some combination of days and hours. Example calendars showing how districts can achieve 1,140 hours are shown in Figure 4 below. School districts and charter schools would be able to secure K-12 Plus funding for schools above 180 days by shortening the hours per day students spend in school.



Student Engagement. The bill defines how schools may satisfy the requirements of an instructional hour, expanding the definition beyond current curricular "school programs" to include targeted interventions, student engagement and enrichment, and career technical education, provided that these opportunities are aligned with academic content and performance standards. Enrollment in New Mexico public schools has steadily declined throughout the course of the Covid-19 pandemic, and in the 2021-2022 school year, <u>more than 40 percent of New Mexico's students were considered "chronically absent,"</u> having been absent for more than 10 percent of the school year.

Declining enrollment, attendance, and performance are symptoms of a disengaged student population that no longer finds relevance in education. The bill emphasizes the need to embed engagement and interventions in the course of a normal school day, ensuring school districts and charter schools have the ability to address all students' needs. According to the <u>Youth Risk and Resiliency Survey</u>, more than 40 percent of students in ninth through 12th grade felt sad or hopeless for two or more weeks straight in 2019, so much so that they stopped doing usual activities. Creating a student-centered education system is critical to improving students' wellbeing academically, socially, and emotionally. The bill is one facet of the LESC's multipronged approach to reengaging New Mexico students, which also includes amending high school graduation requirements to improve their relevance to students and to workforce needs.

Student Academic Performance. Alongside waning student engagement and attendance, academic performance has also declined in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic. Compared with 2019 scores, New Mexico experienced a significant decrease in math and reading scores on the 2022 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), and is ranked last among all 50 states and the District of Columbia. In spring 2022, one in three students in New Mexico was proficient in reading (34 percent), one in three in science (33 percent), and one in four in math (25 percent). Additional learning time represents a critical strategy in addressing the "Covid slide," a gap in opportunity and consequent gap in performance experienced nationwide following the pandemic.

<u>An LESC analysis of 2022 assessment results</u> suggested increasing hours has a modest but statistically significant impact on student achievement in both reading and math, even when controlling for students' economic disadvantages. <u>An LFC program evaluation of time-on-task in 2016</u> had similar findings, but noted substantially better results for schools that added additional school days. The LFC evaluation noted that, while the quantity of hours matter, the quality of those hours tends to matter more. Students in classrooms with high-quality, focused teachers with strong classroom management skills tend to perform better on standardized assessments.

Improving the Teaching Profession and Recognizing Professional Work. The bill professionalizes the work of educators by ensuring minimum school calendar requirements allow space for professional work, including teacher collaboration, mentorship, and professional development. The National Conference of State Legislatures' (NCSL's) <u>No Time To Lose</u> report explains how the world's top-performing countries found success by placing the teaching profession at the center of their instructional systems. According to NCSL, teachers in high performing countries:

"are given a lighter teaching load and more time for their own—and their colleagues'—development. In some of these countries, **30 percent to 35 percent of** a teacher's time is spent teaching students, while the rest is spent on activities such as working in teams with other teachers to develop and improve lessons, observing and critiquing classes, and working with struggling students."

HB130/aHFl/aSFC adopts a research-based approach to professional learning by emphasizing professional work that is embedded in the course of a normal school day. The <u>Learning Policy</u> <u>Institute</u>'s research-based pillars of effective professional development are:

- Collaboration, where teachers to share ideas and collaborate in their learning, often in job-embedded contexts;
- Active learning, where teachers are able to choose learning modules and material based on their interests and needs;
- Modeling, where teachers observe analyze one another, as well as their own recorded lessons;
- Coaching and expert support, where teachers are observed and receive feedback from experts; and
- A sustained duration, such that teachers participate in professional development regularly, sometimes weekly or even daily.

Professional work time embedded in the course of the school day is imperative, given that effective professional development, like observation and coaching, occurs during normal class time. This style of professional work is also supported by the federal <u>Every Student Succeeds Act</u>, which defines professional development as "are sustained (not stand-alone, 1-day, or short-term workshops), intensive, collaborative, job-embedded, data-driven, and classroom-focused..."

The 2016 LFC time-on-task evaluation found that teachers in New Mexico reported "non-teaching responsibilities" like paperwork or other reporting requirements were among the greatest challenges to maximizing the effectiveness of learning time. Making space for professional work is a cornerstone of improving teaching as a profession and could help incentivize college-goers to pursue a career in teaching, retain high-quality teachers for longer periods of time, and potentially recruit former educators back into the classroom.

Learning Time in Other States. According to a <u>50-state comparison of instructional time policies</u> by the Education Commission of the States (ECS), 31 states require at least 180 days of instruction. In addition to instructional days, many states also establish instructional hour requirements, many of which closely mirror New Mexico's current statutory minimums of 990 for elementary school and 1,080 for secondary school. Increasing the minimum hour requirement to 1,140 hours would place New Mexico among the highest hour requirements in the 50 states, but other states rarely contemplate embedded professional work within their instructional hours.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The Public Education Department (PED) will be required to amend administrative rules to ensure the requirements of an instructional day comport with the new criteria the bill establishes. This may include establishing additional performance and content standards for academic interventions, enrichment, and career technical education programs.

PED will be required to annually certify school calendars meet the minimum requirements in this bill, a function PED already executes under current law.

PED will also be required to compile a list of K-12 Plus schools in each district, certify the MEM in each of those schools, and aggregate the program units each school generates to the district level for inclusion in the public school funding formula.

OTHER SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Guidance, Coordination, and Support. The bill encourages school districts to think critically about how to integrate academic engagement and enrichment, career technical education, and professional work in their school calendars, but cannot guarantee school districts and charter schools have the resources necessary to make effective use of this flexibility. Reimagining school calendars in a transformative manner is a significant undertaking that will require support and coordination among the state's many disparate political and administrative entities. Public schools will be best served if PED and legislative staff collaborate on implementation guidance for school districts focused on best practices for embedded enrichment and intervention. However, the gold standard for guidance would be a framework published by a statewide steering commission for education, including representation from PED, LESC, LFC, school districts, charter schools, community organizations, Native American tribes, nations and pueblos, and even parents themselves. Currently, a shared statewide vision for education in New Mexico does not exist.

RELATED BILLS

Conflicts with HB194, Public School Finance Changes, which increases the minimum instructional hours to 1,140, creates a K-12 Plus factor of 0.016 for days above 180 and 0.024 for days above 190, and makes other changes to the public school funding formula.
