19	"27-2-7. GENERAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMQUALIFICATIONS AND
20	PAYMENTS
21	A. Subject to the availability of state funds,
22	public assistance shall be provided under a general assistance
23	program to or on behalf of eligible persons who:
24	(1) are under eighteen years of age and meet
25	all eligibility conditions for the New Mexico Works Act except

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1	the relationship to the person with whom they are living;
2	(2) are over the age of eighteen and are
3	disabled, according to rules of the department, and are not
4	receiving cash assistance or services pursuant to the New
5	Mexico Works Act;
6	(3) meet the qualifications under other rules
7	for the general assistance program as the department shall
8	establish; or
9	(4) are lawful resident immigrants who would
10	otherwise be eligible for cash assistance or services pursuant
11	to the New Mexico Works Act except that they began residing in
12	the United States after August 22, 1996.
13	B. General assistance program payments may be made
14	directly to the recipient or to the vendor of goods or services
15	provided to the recipient. The department may by rule limit
16	the grants that are made to general assistance recipients.
17	[C. Whenever the department makes an adjustment in
18	the standard of need for the New Mexico Works Act, subject to
19	the availability of state funds, it shall make a commensurate
20	adjustment in the standard of need for the general assistance
21	program.]
22	C. The standard of need for general assistance
23	shall be updated annually and shall be no less than fifty
24	percent of the federal poverty level as published in the
25	<u>federal register.</u>
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1	D. The maximum benefit per recipient shall be no
2	less than fifty percent of the department's standard of need
3	and may be increased by the department if state funds are
4	available.
5	E. New payment levels required by this section
6	shall become effective on January 1 each year beginning on
7	<u>January 1, 2024.</u> "
8	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
9	provisions of this act is January 1, 2024.
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
