AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRST RESPONDERS; INCREASING SUPPLEMENTAL DEATH  
BENEFITS TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OR CHILDREN OF FIREFIGHTERS  
KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY FROM TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND  
DOLLARS (\$250,000) TO ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000); MAKING  
APPLICATION OF SUPPLEMENTAL DEATH BENEFITS FOR SURVIVORS OF  
FIREFIGHTERS, NEW MEXICO MOUNTED PATROL MEMBERS OR RESERVE  
POLICE OFFICERS APPLICABLE TO THE DEATHS OF THOSE FIRST  
RESPONDERS IN THE LINE OF DUTY ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2022;  
AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 10-11B-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2007,  
Chapter 149, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"10-11B-5. FIREFIGHTERS' SURVIVORS SUPPLEMENTAL  
BENEFITS--REVIEW COMMITTEE--DETERMINATION--PAYMENT.--

1           A. There is created the "firefighters' survivors  
2 supplemental death benefits review committee". The committee  
3 shall consist of the attorney general or the attorney general's  
4 designee and the fire services council.

5           B. The firefighters' survivors supplemental death  
6 benefits review committee shall determine whether a firefighter  
7 has been killed in the line of duty for a death occurring on or  
8 after January 1, 2022 and advise the state fire marshal of that  
9 determination. In addition to any other death benefits  
10 provided by law, the surviving spouse or children shall be paid  
11 [~~two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000)~~] one million  
12 dollars (\$1,000,000) as supplemental death benefits whenever a  
13 firefighter is killed in the line of duty. The benefits shall  
14 be paid from the fund.

15           C. The benefits shall be paid entirely to the  
16 surviving spouse. If there is no surviving spouse, the  
17 benefits shall be distributed in pro rata shares to all  
18 surviving children. If there are no surviving children or  
19 spouse, benefits shall be distributed to the surviving parents  
20 of the firefighter."

21           SECTION 2. Section 29-4A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995,  
22 Chapter 59, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

23           "29-4A-5. PEACE OFFICERS', NEW MEXICO MOUNTED PATROL  
24 MEMBERS' AND RESERVE POLICE OFFICERS' SURVIVORS SUPPLEMENTAL  
25 DEATH BENEFITS--REVIEW COMMITTEE--DETERMINATION--PAYMENT.--

1           A. There is created the "peace officers', New  
2 Mexico mounted patrol members' and reserve police officers'  
3 survivors supplemental death benefits review committee". The  
4 committee shall consist of the attorney general, the chief of  
5 the New Mexico state police and the state president of the  
6 fraternal order of police or their designees.

7           B. The peace officers', New Mexico mounted patrol  
8 members' and reserve police officers' survivors supplemental  
9 death benefits review committee shall determine whether a peace  
10 officer, New Mexico mounted patrol member or reserve police  
11 officer has been killed in the line of duty for a death  
12 occurring on or after January 1, 2022 and advise the secretary  
13 of that determination. In addition to any other death benefits  
14 provided by law, the surviving spouse, children or parents  
15 shall be paid one million dollars (\$1,000,000) as supplemental  
16 death benefits whenever a peace officer, New Mexico mounted  
17 patrol member or reserve police officer is killed in the line  
18 of duty. The benefits shall be paid from the fund.

19           C. The benefits shall be paid first to the  
20 surviving spouse. If there is no surviving spouse, the  
21 benefits shall be distributed in pro rata shares to all  
22 surviving children. If there are no surviving children or  
23 spouse, benefits shall be distributed to the surviving parents  
24 of the peace officer, New Mexico mounted patrol member or  
25 reserve police officer."
