16	SECTION 1. Section 22-15-8.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2006,
17	Chapter 58, Section 1) is amended to read:
18	"22-15-8.2. READING MATERIALS FUNDCREATEDPURPOSE

20	A. The "reading materials fund" is created in the
21	state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, gifts,
22	grants and donations. Money in the fund shall not revert to
23	any other fund at the end of a fiscal year. The fund shall be
24	administered by the department, and money in the fund is
25	appropriated to the department to assist public schools that

Money in the fund shall be disbursed on warrant of the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of public education or the secretary's authorized representative.

6 Β. A school district that wants to use a scientific 7 research-based core comprehensive, intervention or supplementary reading program aligned with explicit, 8 9 systematic, diagnostic, cumulative instruction in phonological 10 and phonemic awareness, phonics, syllable types, morphology, semantics and syntax may apply to the department for money from 11 12 the reading materials fund to purchase the necessary 13 instructional materials for the selected program. A school 14 district may apply for funding for its reading program if:

(1) core, <u>intervention</u> and supplemental materials are [highly rated by either the Oregon reading first center or the Florida center for reading research or the materials are listed in the international dyslexia association's framework for informed reading and language instruction] on the advisory list of instructional programming created by the Colorado department of education;

(2) the district selects no more than two comprehensive published core reading programs; and

(3) the district has established a <u>literacy</u>
 professional development plan [describing how it will provide
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1 teachers with professional development] that includes a
2 detailed framework for structured literacy training and ongoing
3 support in the effective use of the selected instructional
4 materials."

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Thirty-five million dollars (\$35,000,000) is appropriated from the public education reform fund to the reading materials fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2024 and subsequent fiscal years to carry out the purpose of the reading materials fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the public education reform fund.

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
