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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. A new section of the Unfair Practices Act is
19	enacted to read:
20	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SELLING AND TRANSFERRING HEALTH DATA,
21	MENTAL HEALTH DATA AND LOCATION DATAPROHIBITED ACT
22	PENALTY
23	A. It is unlawful to share, license, sell, trade,
24	transfer or otherwise provide or make available an individual's
25	health data, mental health data or location data except when:

1 (1) expressly required or authorized by law; 2 (2) affirmatively authorized by the individual 3 upon informed consent; or 4 necessary for law enforcement activities (3) 5 undertaken by a law enforcement agency or prosecuting 6 authority. 7 Β. As used in this section: "health data" and "mental health data" 8 (1)9 mean information linked to specific individuals or groups of 10 individuals sharing the same residence or internet protocol 11 address that reveals or describes the search for, attempt to 12 obtain or receipt of any health or mental health services, 13 including the type of specialization of a medical or mental 14 health provider or the provider's clinical facility, any past, 15 present or future disability, physical health condition, mental 16 health condition or health condition of an individual, 17 including pregnancy and miscarriage, and any treatment or 18 diagnosis of such conditions; and 19 (2)"location data" means data capable of 20 determining the past or present physical location of an 21 individual or an individual's internet connection device. 22 A violation of this section shall be subject to C. 23 the civil penalty provided in Section 57-12-11 NMSA 1978, with 24 each instance of violation of Subsection A of this section 25 constituting a separate occurrence."

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1	SECTION 2. Section 57-12-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970,
2	Chapter 38, Section 2) is amended to read:
3	"57-12-11. CIVIL PENALTYIn any action brought under
4	Section [49-15-7 NMSA 1953] <u>57-12-8 NMSA 1978</u> , if the court
5	finds that a person is willfully using or has willfully used a
6	method, act or practice declared unlawful by the Unfair
7	Practices Act, the attorney general, upon petition to the
8	court, may recover on behalf of the state [of New Mexico] a
9	civil penalty of not [exceeding five thousand dollars (\$5,000)
10	per violation] <u>less than five hundred dollars (\$500) and not</u>
11	more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per occurrence."
12	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
13	provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.
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
