11 RELATING TO WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE; ESTABLISHING STANDARDS OF
12 CARE.
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14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

15 SECTION 1. [NEW MATERIAL] STANDARDS OF CARE FOR INDUCED
16 ABORTIONS.--

17 A. A facility that provides abortions shall adhere
18 to the same standards of care that are applied to other types
19 of surgical clinics.

20 B. A health care provider who performs abortions
21 shall maintain the same level of malpractice insurance as
22 health care providers who work at facilities that provide
23 obstetrics and gynecology services.

24 C. A facility that provides abortions shall have:

25 (1) emergency care staff and equipment on-

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1 site; or

2 (2) admitting privileges at a nearby hospital.

3 D. A facility or health care provider that performs
4 an induced abortion on a pregnant woman shall ensure that the
5 pregnant woman receives twenty-four-hour medical care

6 throughout the procedure and until the procedure is complete,
7 the fetus is fully extracted or expelled and the woman may
8 safely be discharged from the facility or health care provider.

9 E. A facility or health care provider shall not use
10 digoxin or potassium chloride to perform an induced abortion.

11 SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] DEFINITIONS.--As used in
12 Section 1 of this 2023 act:

13 A. "facility or health care provider" means a
14 person or entity licensed by the public health division of the
15 department of health; and

16 B. "induced abortion" means an abortion procedure
17 that:

18 (1) uses drugs to induce a pregnant woman into
19 premature labor for the purpose of expelling a fetus from the
20 pregnant woman; and

21 (2) uses digoxin or potassium chloride to
22 inject the heart of a fetus with the intent to stop the fetus's
23 heartbeat and terminate the life of the fetus over a twenty-
24 four-hour period and prior to expulsion from a pregnant woman.

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
