13	RESPIRATORY AND CIRCULATORY FUNCTIONS ARE BEING ARTIFICIALLY
14	SUSTAINED AFTER A PHYSICIAN HAS OBSERVED OR CONDUCTED A TEST TO
15	DETERMINE IRREVERSIBLE CESSATION OF CIRCULATORY, RESPIRATORY OR
16	BRAIN FUNCTIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	SECTION 1. Section 12-2-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
20	Chapter 174, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:
21	"12-2-4. DETERMINATION OF DEATH
22	A. For all medical, legal and statutory purposes,
23	death occurs when an individual has sustained either:
24	(1) irreversible cessation of circulatory or
25	respiratory functions; or

1 irreversible cessation of all functions of (2) 2 the entire brain, including the brain stem. 3 A determination of death shall be made in Β. 4 accordance with accepted medical standards. 5 C. Death is to be pronounced pursuant to the 6 provisions of Subsection A of this section before [artificial 7 means of supporting circulatory or respiratory functions are 8 terminated and before] any vital organ is removed for purposes 9 of transplantation, therapy, research or education in compliance with the provisions of the Jonathan Spradling 10 Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act. If the respiratory and 11 12 circulatory functions of a person are being artificially sustained under accepted medical standards, a determination 13 14 that death has occurred may be made by a physician by observing and conducting a test, including removal of the artificial 15 support, to determine that the irreversible cessation of 16 circulatory or respiratory functions or irreversible cessation 17 of all functions of the brain has occurred. 18 The definition of death set forth in Subsection D. 19 A of this section is to be [utilized] used for all purposes in 20 this state, including civil and criminal actions, 21 notwithstanding any other law to the contrary." 22 23

**SECTION 2.** EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
