the number of students served by the (5) funding, disaggregated by race and qualification for free and reduced-price lunch; and

(6) applicable data outlining progress toward program goals.

If elementary and secondary school emergency D. relief funding remains unspent by a school district or statechartered charter school after May 31, 2023, a second report shall be submitted by the school district or state-chartered charter school to the department detailing the same contents as .223675.1

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the first report required by Subsection C of this section by 2 July 1, 2024. If elementary and secondary school emergency relief funding remains unspent by a school district or state-3 chartered charter school after May 31, 2024, a third report shall be submitted by the school district or state-chartered charter school to the department detailing the same contents as the first report required by Subsection C of this section by July 1, 2025. 8

Ε. The department shall publish all submitted 10 reports from school districts and state-chartered charter 11 schools on its website within thirty days of receiving the 12 reports.

For the purposes of this section, "elementary F. and secondary school emergency relief funding" means funding from the elementary and secondary school emergency relief fund as provided in the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021."

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
