25	(1) "rural community" means an incorporated

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1 municipality with a population of thirty thousand or less or an 2 unincorporated area that has been identified as a designated 3 census place or a census tract by the United States census 4 bureau that is not within ten miles of an incorporated 5 municipality with a population of more than thirty thousand 6 according to the most recent federal decennial census; and

(2) "tribal community" means a federally or state recognized Indian nation, pueblo or tribe or a political subdivision of a federally or state recognized Indian nation, pueblo or tribe within New Mexico."

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Two million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$2,800,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the board of regents of New Mexico state university for expenditure in fiscal years 2024 through 2027 to staff and operate the rural and tribal development institute. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2027 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2023.

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
