11	RELATING TO OUTDOOR RECREATION; TRANSFERRING ADMINISTRATION OF
12	THE RIO GRANDE TRAIL COMMISSION AND THE RIO GRANDE TRAIL FUND
13	FROM THE ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT TO
14	THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING DUTIES TO THE
15	NEW MEXICO OUTDOOR RECREATION DIVISION OF THE ECONOMIC
16	DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT TO COMPLETE THE RIO GRANDE TRAIL; MAKING
17	AN APPROPRIATION.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
20	SECTION 1. Section 9-5C-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2015,
21	Chapter 20, Section 1) is amended to read:

25	A. The "Rio Grande trail commission" is created to

1 establish the Rio Grande trail to run the length of the state 2 from Colorado to Texas. The Rio Grande trail shall be a 3 recreation trail for New Mexico residents and visitors to enjoy 4 the natural beauty of New Mexico and the Rio Grande and learn 5 about the culture and history of New Mexico. The trail shall 6 be established in a manner that seeks to minimize environmental 7 impacts and preserve sensitive habitat. The commission shall 8 define and recommend viable path routes of the Rio Grande 9 trail, mitigate challenges related to its establishment and 10 define and recommend other features, facilities and 11 enhancements needed on the trail. The commission shall also 12 make recommendations to the legislature as needed and report 13 annually to the governor and the appropriate interim committees 14 that deal with water and natural resources and rural and 15 economic development. The commission shall consist of members 16 appointed by the [secretary of energy, minerals and natural 17 resources] director of the New Mexico outdoor recreation 18 division of the economic development department and shall 19 include:

(1) the secretary of energy, minerals and natural resources or the secretary's designee;

[F.] <u>G.</u> Eminent domain shall not be used to establish or construct the Rio Grande trail or features, facilities or enhancements associated with the trail.

[6-] <u>H.</u> The "Rio Grande trail fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, donations, grants to the fund, income from investment of the fund and money otherwise accruing to the fund. Money in the fund shall not revert to any other fund at the end of a fiscal year. The [energy, minerals and natural resources] economic <u>development</u> department shall administer the fund, and money in the fund is subject to appropriation by the legislature to the [energy, minerals and natural resources] economic development department <u>for the New Mexico outdoor recreation division</u> to develop, establish and support the Rio Grande trail. Money in the fund shall be disbursed on warrants signed by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of [energy, minerals and natural resources] economic development or the secretary's authorized

I. For the purposes of this section, "commission" 2 means the Rio Grande trail commission." 3 4 SECTION 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION--TRANSFER OF 5 APPROPRIATIONS, RECORDS AND CONTRACTS TO THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT. -- On the effective date of this act: 6 7 all functions, appropriations, money, records Α. 8 and files of the energy, minerals and natural resources 9 department relating to the Rio Grande trail commission and 10 establishment of the Rio Grande trail shall be transferred to 11 the economic development department; 12 all contractual obligations of the energy, Β. 13 minerals and natural resources department relating to the Rio 14 Grande trail commission and establishment of the Rio Grande 15 trail shall be binding on the economic development department; 16 and 17 C. the rules, orders and decisions of the energy, 18 minerals and natural resources department relating to the Rio 19 Grande trail commission and establishment of the Rio Grande 20 trail shall remain in effect until repealed or amended. 21 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. -- Two hundred twenty-five 22 thousand dollars (\$225,000) is appropriated from the general 23 fund to the economic development department for expenditure in 24 fiscal year 2024 for personnel and operational expenses needed 25 to support the development of the Rio Grande trail and .223203.4 - 9 -
