AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND; PROVIDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 1 APPROVED BY THE VOTERS IN 2022, WHICH PROVIDES FOR AN ADDITIONAL DISTRIBUTION FROM THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 19-1-17 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1917, Chapter 115, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"19-1-17. PERMANENT, INCOME AND CURRENT FUNDS--CREATING DEPOSITS.--

The following funds are created. [B.] To the credit of these funds, in the respective proportions to which they are by law entitled, all money derived from state lands shall be deposited by the commissioner with the state treasurer, as nearly as possible, on the first day of each .223928.1
