secretary, the appointee may receive a permanent commission as 2 a member of the New Mexico state police. However, the 3 probationary period may be extended beyond a two-year period upon the recommendation of the chief with the concurrence of the secretary. This subsection shall not apply to officers who are certified and commissioned as of June 30, 2015 in the 7 former motor transportation division or the former special 8 investigations division. Members who are on probation on July 9 1, 2015 shall complete the probationary period under which they 10 were hired.

11 Β. The salaries of all members of the New Mexico 12 state police, probationary and permanent, and that of the chief 13 shall be fixed by the secretary. The secretary shall annually 14 review the salaries of the New Mexico state police and other 15 law enforcement agencies in the state and shall adjust the 16 salaries of the New Mexico state police, if necessary, to 17 ensure that members of the New Mexico state police are the 18 highest-paid law enforcement officers in the state."
