5	EXPENSES, INCLUDING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE, THE
6	LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE, THE LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION
7	STUDY COMMITTEE, THE SENATE RULES COMMITTEE, THE HOUSE CHIEF
8	CLERK'S OFFICE, THE SENATE CHIEF CLERK'S OFFICE AND OTHER
9	EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
12	SECTION 1. SESSION EXPENSES
13	A. There is appropriated from the general fund for
14	the expense of the legislative department of the state of New
15	Mexico for the first session of the fifty-sixth legislature
16	for per diem and mileage of its members, for salaries of
17	employees and for other expenses of the legislature, eleven
18	million seven hundred forty-seven thousand one hundred
19	dollars (\$11,747,100) or so much thereof as may be necessary
20	for such purposes.
21	B. The expenditures referred to in Subsection A of
22	this section are as follows:
23	(1) per diem for senators \$ 448,600;
24	(2) per diem for members of the house of
25	representatives \$ 788,000; HB l ec Page l

1 (3) mileage traveled by members of the 2 senate going to and returning from the seat of government by 3 the usually traveled route, one round trip. . . . \$ 7,300; (4) mileage traveled by members of the house 4 of representatives going to and returning from the seat of 5 government by the usually traveled route, one round trip. . . 6 7 (5) salaries and employee benefits of senate 8 \$ 4,765,400; 9 (6) salaries and employee benefits of house 10 of representatives employees. . . . . . . . . \$ 2,927,600; 11 (7) for expense of the senate not itemized 12 above, seven hundred forty-two thousand five hundred dollars 13 (\$742,500). No part of this item may be transferred to 14 salaries or employee benefits; 15 (8) for expense of the house of 16 representatives not itemized above, five hundred one thousand 17 four hundred dollars (\$501,400). No part of this item may be 18 transferred to salaries or employee benefits; and 19 (9) for session expenses of the legislative 20 council service, the joint billroom and mailroom and joint 21 legislative switchboard, one million five hundred fifty-five 22 thousand four hundred dollars (\$1,555,400) to be disbursed 23 upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative 24 council service or the director's designee. 25

1 C. The expenditures for the senate shall be 2 disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' 3 committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief clerk's designee. The expenditures for the house of 4 representatives shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the 5 speaker and chief clerk of the house or the chief clerk's 6 designee. Following adjournment of the session, expenditures 7 8 authorized pursuant to Paragraphs (1) through (8) of Subsection B of this section shall be disbursed upon vouchers 9 signed by the director of the legislative council service or 10 the director's designee. 11

Under the printing contracts entered into for D. 12 the first session of the fifty-sixth legislature, the chair 13 of the committees' committee of the senate, subject to the 14 approval of the committee, and the speaker of the house of 15 representatives are authorized and directed to provide for 16 the printing of all bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, 17 memorials and joint memorials introduced in the senate or 18 house, the printing of the bill locator and the printing of 19 all necessary stationery required for use in the respective 20 They are further directed to provide for the houses. 21 purchase of all supplies necessary for use in the respective 22 houses within the appropriation provided. The orders for 23 printing, stationery and supplies shall be approved by the 24 chair of the committees' committee in the senate or by the 25

speaker of the house.

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2 SECTION 2. BILLS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS.--For the 3 first session of the fifty-sixth legislature, bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials 4 5 delivered to the printer shall be returned by the printer to the joint billroom within forty-two hours after they are 6 ordered to be printed. The billroom personnel shall supply a 7 8 complete file of bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials, joint memorials and other printed distribution 9 materials to the following: 10 upon request, one copy to each member of the 11 Α. house of representatives and the senate; 12 B. upon written request, one copy to each county 13 clerk, district judge, radio or television station and 14 newspaper and to the general library of each state-supported 15 institution of higher learning; and 16 C. upon written request, one copy to each state 17 department, commission, board, institution or agency, each 18 elected state official, each incorporated municipality, each 19 district attorney, each ex-governor, each member of the New 20 Mexico congressional delegation and each school district in 21 the state. 22

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE.--There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service, to be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the director

of the legislative council service or the director's designee:

> Α. for fiscal year 2024, the following: Personal Services & Employee Benefits \$6,652,100 Contractual Services 820,000 Other Costs 1,076,700 Total \$8,548,800;

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for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, Β. 9 seven hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$720,000) for 10 additional interim committee staff or contractors to support 11 interim committees and to provide legal and policy research 12 or other services necessary to support the legislature. 13

**SECTION 4.** LEGISLATURE.--There is appropriated from the 14 general fund, unless otherwise indicated, for the expense of the legislative department, not provided for in Section 1 of this act, for fiscal year 2024, unless otherwise indicated, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, the following:

for travel expenses of legislators other than Α. 21 New Mexico legislative council members, on legislative 22 council business, for committee travel, staff and other 23 necessary expenses for other interim committees and for other 24 necessary legislative expenses, for fiscal years 2023 and 25

2024, four million dollars (\$4,000,000); provided that the
 New Mexico legislative council may transfer amounts from the
 appropriation in this subsection, during the fiscal years for
 which appropriated, to any other legislative appropriation
 where they may be needed;

B. for pre-session expenditures and for necessary contracts, supplies and personnel for interim session preparation, five hundred ten thousand dollars (\$510,000);

9 C. for a statewide legislative intern program,
10 fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000);

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D. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, for dues and fees of national organizations of which the legislature is a member, four hundred thirty-five thousand three hundred dollars (\$435,300);

E. for the legislative information system, for fiscal years 2023 and 2024, two million one hundred fortythree thousand nine hundred dollars (\$2,143,900);

18 F. for the interim duties of the senate rules 19 committee, thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000);

G. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 through 2026, for the ongoing planning, output development and design of a legislative processing system, nine million five hundred thousand dollars (\$9,500,000);

H. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, for audiovisual upgrades to committee rooms for virtual,

hybrid and webcasting hardware, software and installation, one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000);

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I. for the contractual services of the capitol buildings planning commission, one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000);

J. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 through 2026, the purchase and installation of a constituent services platform, including applicable licenses and subscriptions, five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000);

K. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, for upgrades to the house and senate chamber display boards, one million three hundred thousand dollars (\$1,300,000); and

L. for expenditure in fiscal years 2023 and 2024, to hire a consulting entity to consider the feasibility of and make recommendations to the New Mexico legislative council on the logistics and resources needed for district staff offices and operations for the legislature, two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000).

SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE.--There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative finance committee, to be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the chair of the committee or the chair's designated representative for fiscal year 2024, the following:

8 SECTION 9. OFFICIAL MASTER DATABASE OF LAWS--SELF-PUBLICATION--FREE ACCESS TECHNOLOGY--HARD-COPY PUBLICATION.--9 There is appropriated from the legislative cash balances for 10 the legislative department's share of the continued 11 development required for the master database of official 12 annotated laws of the state, markup language and tagging and 13 its use for legislative document systems and a tagged 14 database of the session laws and for the costs associated in 15 collaborating with the New Mexico compilation commission on 16 the ongoing development and expanding partnership role with 17 the New Mexico compilation commission in the self-publication 18 of the New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1978, including 19 technology for freely accessible laws and hard-copy 20 publication, four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for 21 expenditure during fiscal years 2023 and 2024. 22

SECTION 10. CATEGORY TRANSFER.--Amounts set out in Sections 3 through 8 of this act are provided for informational purposes only and may be transferred among

categories.

SECTION 11. PERFORMANCE MEASURES.--Each legislative agency shall adhere to the performance measures specified in its strategic plan and shall make reports as required in that plan. SECTION 12.
