8	SECTION 1. A new Section 13-1-63.1 NMSA 1978 is enacted
9	to read:

11	"Instructional materials" means school textbooks and other
12	educational media that are used as the basis for instruction,
13	including combinations of textbooks, learning kits,

F. travel or shipping by common carrier or by private conveyance or to meals and lodging;

19 G. purchase of livestock at auction rings or to 20 the procurement of animals to be used for research and 21 experimentation or exhibit;

H. contracts with businesses for public schooltransportation services;

I. procurement of tangible personal property or
services, as defined by Sections 13-1-87 and 13-1-93 NMSA

1978, by the corrections industries division of the corrections department pursuant to rules adopted by the corrections industries commission, which shall be reviewed by the purchasing division of the general services department prior to adoption;

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J. purchases not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) consisting of magazine subscriptions, web-based or electronic subscriptions, conference registration fees and other similar purchases where prepayments are required;

K. municipalities having adopted home rule 10 charters and having enacted their own purchasing ordinances; 11

L. the issuance, sale and delivery of public securities pursuant to the applicable authorizing statute, with the exception of bond attorneys and general financial consultants;

contracts entered into by a local public body М. with a private independent contractor for the operation, or provision and operation, of a jail pursuant to Sections 18 33-3-26 and 33-3-27 NMSA 1978;

N. contracts for maintenance of grounds and 20 facilities at highway rest stops and other employment 21 opportunities, excluding those intended for the direct care 22 and support of persons with handicaps, entered into by state 23 agencies with private, nonprofit, independent contractors who 24 provide services to persons with handicaps; 25

1 0. contracts and expenditures for services or 2 items of tangible personal property to be paid or compensated 3 by money or other property transferred to New Mexico law enforcement agencies by the United States department of 4 justice drug enforcement administration; 5

P. contracts for retirement and other benefits pursuant to Sections 22-11-47 through 22-11-52 NMSA 1978;

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Q. contracts with professional entertainers;

contracts and expenditures for legal R. 9 subscription and research services and litigation expenses in 10 connection with proceedings before administrative agencies or 11 state or federal courts, including experts, mediators, court 12 reporters, process servers and witness fees, but not 13 including attorney contracts; 14

contracts for service relating to the design, S. 15 engineering, financing, construction and acquisition of 16 public improvements undertaken in improvement districts 17 pursuant to Subsection L of Section 3-33-14.1 NMSA 1978 and 18 in county improvement districts pursuant to Subsection L of 19 Section 4-55A-12.1 NMSA 1978; 20

T. works of art for museums or for display in public buildings or places; 22

U. contracts entered into by a local public body with a person, firm, organization, corporation or association or a state educational institution named in Article 12,

Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico for the
 operation and maintenance of a hospital pursuant to Chapter
 3, Article 44 NMSA 1978, lease or operation of a county
 hospital pursuant to the Hospital Funding Act or operation
 and maintenance of a hospital pursuant to the Special
 Hospital District Act;

7 V. purchases of advertising in all media,
8 including radio, television, print and electronic;

9 W. purchases of promotional goods intended for10 resale by the tourism department;

X. procurement of printing, publishing and distribution services for materials produced and intended for resale by the cultural affairs department;

Y. procurement by or through the public education 14 department from the federal department of education relating 15 to parent training and information centers designed to 16 increase parent participation, projects and initiatives 17 designed to improve outcomes for students with disabilities 18 and other projects and initiatives relating to the 19 administration of improvement strategy programs pursuant to 20 the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act; 21 provided that the exemption applies only to procurement of 22 services not to exceed two hundred thousand dollars 23 (\$200,000); 24

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Z. procurement of services from community

1 rehabilitation programs or qualified individuals pursuant to
2 the State Use Act;

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AA. purchases of products or services for eligible persons with disabilities pursuant to the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973;

BB. procurement, by either the department of health or Grant county or both, of tangible personal property, services or construction that are exempt from the Procurement Code pursuant to Section 9-7-6.5 NMSA 1978;

10 CC. contracts for investment advisory services, 11 investment management services or other investment-related 12 services entered into by the educational retirement board, 13 the state investment officer or the retirement board created 14 pursuant to the Public Employees Retirement Act;

DD. the purchase for resale by the state fair commission of feed and other items necessary for the upkeep of livestock;

EE. contracts entered into by the crime victims reparation commission to distribute federal grants to assist victims of crime, including grants from the federal Victims of Crime Act of 1984 and the federal Violence Against Women Act of 1994;

FF. procurement by or through the early childhood education and care department of early pre-kindergarten and pre-kindergarten services purchased pursuant to the Pre-

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Kindergarten Act;

GG. procurement of services of commissioned advertising sales representatives for New Mexico magazine; and

HH. procurements exempt from the Procurement Code as otherwise provided by law."

SECTION 3. Section 13-1-99 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1984, Chapter 65, Section 72, as amended) is amended to read:

"13-1-99. EXCLUDED FROM CENTRAL PURCHASING THROUGH THE STATE PURCHASING AGENT .-- Excluded from the requirement of procurement through the state purchasing agent but not from the requirements of the Procurement Code are the following:

> C. emergency procurement;

D. procurement of highway construction or reconstruction by the department of transportation; 18

Ε. procurement by the judicial branch of state 19 government; 20

F. procurement by the legislative branch of state 21 government; 22

G. procurement by the boards of regents of state 23 educational institutions named in Article 12, Section 11 of 24 the constitution of New Mexico; 25
