9	SECTION 1. Section 63-9K-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021,	
10	Chapter 120, Section 2) is amended to read:	
11	"63-9K-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Connect New	
12	Mexico Act:	
13	A. "2020 broadband plan" means the State of New	
14	Mexico Broadband Strategic Plan and Rural Broadband	
15	Assessment published by the department of information	
16	technology in June 2020;	
17	B. "broadband infrastructure" means any facilities	
18	and equipment used to provide internet service, excluding	
19	telecommunications equipment owned, controlled or operated by	
20	a public or private end-user;	
21	C. "broadband office" means the office of	
22	broadband access and expansion;	
23	D. "council" means the connect New Mexico council;	
24	E. "department" means the department of	
25	information technology;	HGEIC/HB 262/a Page l

F. "digital equity" means information technology
 needed for civic and cultural participation, employment,
 education, business and economic development, lifelong
 learning and access to essential services generally available
 to residents regardless of their racial grouping,
 socioeconomic status or cultural identity;

7 G. "digital inclusion" means access to and the8 ability to use information technologies;

9 H. "end-user" means an individual, business,
10 institution or governmental entity that subscribes to an
11 internet service and does not resell that service to other
12 individuals or entities;

I. "federal assistance funding" means federal
grant and loan programs that provide full or matching funding
for the development or maintenance of broadband
infrastructure, training in the use or administration of
internet-based services or the purchase of computers or other
devices that access the internet;

19 J. "internet" means a global set of computing and 20 electronic devices interconnected through networking 21 infrastructures to provide data and information sharing and 22 communication facilities;

K. "local government" means the government of a municipality, county or political subdivision of the state or an entity operating pursuant to a joint powers agreement

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pursuant to the Planning District Act or the Regional
 Planning Act;

L. "public educational institution" means a public school that receives state funding for its operations, a school district, a public post-secondary educational institution or a state agency that provides administrative services, funding or technical support to public schools, school districts and public post-secondary educational institutions;

M. "quality of service" means the standards for broadband service established by the broadband office that meet or exceed the baseline standards established by the federal communications commission;

N. "statewide broadband plan" means a plan
developed by the broadband office that may be an updated
revision of the 2020 broadband plan; provided that, upon
Senate Bill 93 of the first session of the fifty-fifth
legislature becoming law, "statewide broadband plan" means
the statewide broadband plan developed pursuant to that law;

20 0. "tribal government" means the government of a
21 federally or state-recognized Indian nation, pueblo or tribe;

P. "underserved" means an area or property that does not have access to internet service offering speeds greater than one hundred megabits downstream and twenty megabits upstream; and

Q. "unserved" means an area or property that 1 2 either does not have access to internet service at all or 3 only has access to internet service offering speeds below twenty-five megabits per second downstream or three megabits 4 per second upstream." 5 SECTION 2. Section 63-9K-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021, 6 Chapter 120, Section 3) is amended to read: 7 8 "63-9K-3. COUNCIL CREATED--POWERS.--The "connect New Mexico council" is created and Α. 9 administratively attached to the department. 10 Β. The council is composed of the following 11 fifteen members: 12 (1) the secretary of transportation or the 13 secretary's designee; 14 the secretary of economic development or (2) 15 the secretary's designee; 16 (3) the secretary of cultural affairs or the 17 secretary's designee; 18 (4) the secretary of information technology 19 or the secretary's designee; 20 the executive director of the New Mexico (5) 21 mortgage finance authority or the executive director's 22 designee; 23 (6) the secretary of higher education or the 24 secretary's designee; HGEIC/HB 262/a 25 Page 4

1 (7) the director of the public school 2 facilities authority or the director's designee; 3 (8) five members of the public who have experience with broadband access and connectivity challenges 4 for either private business or public institutions, appointed 5 as follows: 6 one member appointed by the speaker (a) 7 8 of the house of representatives; one member appointed by the (b) 9 minority floor leader of the house of representatives; 10 (c) one member appointed by the 11 president pro tempore of the senate; 12 one member appointed by the (d) 13 minority floor leader of the senate; and 14 (e) one member appointed by the 15 governor; and 16 (9) three members appointed by the secretary 17 of Indian affairs: one representative of the Navajo Nation, 18 one representative of Apache tribal governments and one 19 representative of Indian pueblo tribal governments, who are 20 experienced with broadband access and connectivity issues. 21 C. affirmative vote of at least a majority of a quorum present shall be necessary for an action to be taken by the council.

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D. Each member of the council appointed pursuant to Paragraph (8) or (9) of Subsection B of this section shall be appointed to a four-year term; provided that to provide for staggered terms:

two of the members initially appointed (1)pursuant to Paragraph (8) of Subsection B of this section shall be appointed for a term of two years by lot; and

(2) one member initially appointed pursuant to Paragraph (9) of Subsection B of this section shall be initially appointed for a term of two years by lot.

Public members of the council shall be Ε. reimbursed for attending meetings of the council as provided for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

F. Public members of the council are appointed public officials of the state while carrying out their duties and activities under the Connect New Mexico Act. 20

G. Council members shall be governed by the 21 Governmental Conduct Act. 22

B. On or before August 1, 2023, the council shall 12 report on the digital equity analysis and plan to the 13 broadband office and appropriate interim legislative 14 committees. 15

C. On or before January 1, 2024, the broadband office shall incorporate the digital equity analysis and plan and its recommendations into the statewide broadband plan.

D. The broadband office shall cooperate with and provide relevant broadband-related information it collects or develops with the council."

SECTION 5. Section 63-9K-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021, Chapter 120, Section 6) is amended to read:

"63-9K-6. CONNECT NEW MEXICO FUND CREATED.--

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The "connect New Mexico fund" is created in the HGEIC/HB 262/a Page 8

1 state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, gifts, 2 grants and donations. Money in the fund is subject to 3 appropriation by the legislature to the council for the purpose of administering the broadband grant program. 4 Disbursements from the fund shall be made upon warrants drawn 5 by the secretary of finance and administration pursuant to 6 vouchers signed by the chair of the council. Any unexpended 7 8 or unencumbered balance in the fund remaining at the end of any fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund. 9 The broadband office shall implement a grant Β. 10 program to develop and expand broadband infrastructure and 11 services and support digital inclusion; provided that the 12 broadband office shall each year seek to award grants for 13 proposals submitted by the following entities throughout the 14 state: 15 (1)local governments; 16 (2) state agencies; 17 (3) public educational institutions; 18 (4) tribal governments; 19 (5) entities created by a joint powers 20 agreement pursuant to the Joint Powers Agreements Act; and 21 (6) private entities for broadband 22 infrastructure to provide service primarily for residential 23 purposes. 24 When approving grants from the connect New C. 25

1 Mexico fund, the broadband office shall give consideration 2 to: 3 (1) the extent to which the project connects unserved and underserved populations of New Mexico, with 4 5 priority given to projects that will connect unserved populations; 6 (2) the extent to which the project meets or 7 8 exceeds the baseline standards established by the federal communications commission; 9 (3) the extent to which the project 10 leverages existing infrastructure; 11 (4) the extent to which the project 12 complements or coordinates with the statewide broadband plan; 13 (5) the extent to which the project 14 leverages regional collaboration; 15 the degree to which the project fosters (6) 16 digital inclusion; 17 the extent to which the project (7) 18 stimulates in-state economic development, including the 19 creation of jobs and apprenticeships; 20 the extent to which the project (8) 21 leverages in-kind or financial support from local agencies or 22 entities, federal assistance funding or federal Coronavirus 23 Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, federal Consolidated 24 Appropriations Act, 2021 or federal American Rescue Plan Act 25

A. By October 1 of each year, the broadband		
office, in coordination with the council, shall provide to		
the appropriate legislative interim committees a report on		
the access to and quality of service of broadband across the		
state. Information shall be provided on a county-by-county		
basis.		
B. The report shall contain the following		
information:		
(1) progress achieved toward digital equity		
and digital inclusion as identified in the digital equity		
analysis and plan;		
(2) progress achieved on implementation of
