1 AN ACT 2 RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION; PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT 3 OF TWO AMERICAN INDIAN EDUCATION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CENTERS 4 IN THE STATE; PROVIDING POWERS AND DUTIES; REQUIRING REQUESTS 5 FOR PROPOSALS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CENTERS. 6 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: 8 SECTION 1. A new section of Chapter 21 NMSA 1978 is 9 enacted to read: 10 "AMERICAN INDIAN EDUCATION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE 11 CENTERS--HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TO ESTABLISH--12 PROCUREMENT FOR CENTERS' OPERATIONS -- POWERS AND DUTIES .--13 Α. The higher education department shall establish 14 two American Indian education technical assistance centers to 15 provide technical assistance and support for tribal education 16 departments and tribal communities, with a primary focus on 17 American Indian students' education and success, while also 18 working in partnership with the higher education department, 19 the public education department and the early childhood 20 education and care department to support: 21 (1) the development of culturally relevant 22 and linguistically appropriate curriculum and instructional 23 materials; 24 (2) career pathways for American Indian 25 educators;

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1 professional development opportunities (3) 2 for licensed school employees and school administrators in 3 culturally and linguistically relevant pedagogy; 4 education policy developments and (4) 5 capacity building for tribal communities; 6 (5) collaboration with state education 7 agencies on tribal-related programs to help agencies with outreach, recommend indigenous educators, scholars and 8 professionals as consultants to tribal programs and 9 10 participate in funding applications to support the technical assistance centers and other statewide indigenous education 11 efforts; 12 13 (6) collaboration with institutions serving American Indian students, including school districts, charter 14 15 schools, early childhood centers and programs, bureau of Indian education schools and public and tribal higher 16 education institutions; and 17 additional responsibilities or duties 18 (7) related to American Indian education or vocational support 19 20 determined by consultation among the various stakeholders. Β. Two American Indian education technical 21 assistance centers in geographically distinct regions of the 22 state shall serve all American Indian students and federally 23 recognized Indian nations, tribes and pueblos located wholly 24 or partially in New Mexico. The higher education department 25

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shall seek tribal input and feedback from the public education department and the early childhood education and care department for the preparation of a request for proposals to operate a center and provide the services specified in the request for proposals, including the:

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(1) types of technical assistance provided to institutions serving American Indian students, including school districts, charter schools, early childhood centers, homes and programs, bureau of Indian education schools, public and tribal higher education institutions, tribally operated departments and tribal governments; and

partnerships the centers propose to 12 (2) develop, including with state agencies, school districts, 13 charter schools, early education centers, homes and programs, 14 15 bureau of Indian education schools, federally recognized Indian nations, tribes and pueblos and public and tribal 16 higher education institutions.

The higher education department's request for С. 18 proposals shall prioritize applications from tribal colleges 19 20 and universities in New Mexico, American Indian programs at New Mexico public higher education institutions and tribally 21 controlled institutions and entities with demonstrated 22 experience and knowledge of working with American Indian 23 students and federally recognized Indian nations, tribes and 24 pueblos located wholly or partially in New Mexico and include 25
