BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 24-17B-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021, Chapter 111, Section 2) is amended to read:

"24-17B-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act:

- A. "department" means the department of health;
- B. "direct care service" means services provided to long-term care facility residents that maintain or improve the health and quality of life of the residents;
- C. "direct care service staff member" means a person employed by or contracted with a long-term care facility to provide in-person direct care services to long-term care facility residents. "Direct care service staff member" does not include a registered nurse licensed pursuant to the Nursing Practice Act or a physician licensed pursuant to the Medical Practice Act who has received specialized training or education in geriatric care; and
- D. "long-term care facility" means a long-term care facility licensed by the state that is not otherwise required to provide at least four hours of dementia care

1	training under state or federal law. "Long-term care
2	facility" does not include a facility licensed pursuant to
3	the Public Health Act as an intermediate care facility for
4	individuals with intellectual disabilities."
5	SECTION 2. Section 24-17B-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021,
6	Chapter 111, Section 3) is amended to read:
7	"24-17B-3. TRAINING REQUIRED
8	A. Each long-term care facility that is subject to
9	the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall
10	provide at least four hours of dementia training to each
11	direct care service staff member that it employs on:
12	(1) recognizing and treating Alzheimer's
13	disease and dementia;
14	(2) person-centered care;
15	(3) activities of daily living;
16	(4) an overview of the different types of
17	dementia;
18	(5) strategies to manage the behavior of
19	people who have dementia; and
20	(6) strategies to effectively communicate
21	with people who have dementia.
22	B. Training may be online or in-person and shall
23	be a training program of at least four hours. Each long-term
24	care facility shall submit the training program that it uses
25	or proposes to use to the department for review. If the HB 446/a Page 2

department finds that the training program does not satisfy the purposes of the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act, it shall require the long-term care facility to submit a new proposed training program.

- C. A person designing the training shall have at least two years of work experience related to Alzheimer's disease, dementia, health care, gerontology or other related field.
- D. Every direct care service staff member shall complete the requirements for and obtain a training certificate as provided in Subsection E of this section.
 - E. A direct care service staff member:
- (1) hired after January 1, 2022 shall complete the training required pursuant to this section within ninety days of the start of employment;
- (2) hired prior to January 1, 2022 who has not received training equivalent to the requirements set forth in the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall complete training within sixty days of January 1, 2022;
- (3) hired prior to January 1, 2022 who received training within the past twenty-four months equivalent to the requirements set forth in the Long-Term Care Facility Dementia Training Act shall be issued a training certificate by the long-term care facility that employs the direct care service staff member; and

1	(4) who has successfully obtained a training
2	certificate but has had a lapse of dementia-related direct
3	care service employment for twenty-four consecutive months or
4	more shall complete training within ninety days of the start
5	of employment.
6	F. Any long-term care facility that contracts for
7	the services of a direct care service staff member may
8	include a requirement in the contract that the direct care
9	service staff member has received dementia care training that

12	SECTION 3. Section 24-17B-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021,

16	department, the department shall:
17	A. identify, publish a list of and periodically

15	Act to long-term care facilities within ninety days of the
16	effective date of this act.
17	SECTION 6. APPLICABILITYThe provisions of Subsection
18	F of Section 24-17B-3 NMSA 1978 apply to agreements, or
19	renewals or extensions of agreements, executed on or after the
20	effective date of this act

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
