7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:			
8	SECTION 1. ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER DEMENTIA			
9	ADVISORY COUNCIL CREATED			
10	A. The "Alzheimer's disease and other dementia			
11	advisory council" is created and shall be administratively			
12	attached to the aging and long-term services department. The			
13	Alzheimer's disease and other dementia advisory council			
14	consists of:			
15	(1) the following eleven voting members:			
16	(a) one individual living with			
17	Alzheimer's disease or other dementia or a relative of an			
18	individual living with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia;			
19	(b) one individual who is related to			
20	and the caregiver of an individual living with Alzheimer's			
21	disease or other dementia;			
22	(c) one individual who represents			
23	nursing homes;			
24	(d) one individual who represents			
25	assisted living facilities;	HB 471 Page l		

1 one individual who represents (e) 2 providers of adult daycare services; 3 (f) one individual who represents home 4 care providers; 5 (g) one physician who has experience 6 diagnosing and treating Alzheimer's disease; (h) one individual who researches 7 8 Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; one individual who represents a 9 (i) 10 national organization that advocates on behalf of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; 11 (j) one individual who represents the 12 area agencies on aging; and 13 (k) one individual who represents an 14 15 organization that advocates for older adults; and the following four nonvoting members: 16 (2) the director of the division of (a) 17 health improvement of the department of health or the 18 director's designee; 19 20 (b) the secretary of aging and longterm services or the secretary's designee; 21 (c) the director of the medical 22 assistance division of the human services department or the 23 director's designee; and 24 (d) the state long-term care ombudsman 25 HB 471 Page 2 or the ombudsman's designee.

Each voting member shall be appointed by the 2 Β. 3 secretary of aging and long-term services and shall serve for 4 a term of two years and until the voting member's successor 5 is appointed and qualified. A voting member shall not serve 6 more than two consecutive terms. The secretary of aging and long-term services shall appoint all eleven voting members no 7 later than ninety days after the effective date of this 2023 8 9 act.

Members of the Alzheimer's disease and other 10 C. dementia advisory council are entitled to per diem and 11 mileage pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act but shall 12 receive no other compensation for their services on the 13 council. 14

15 D. Members of the Alzheimer's disease and other dementia advisory council shall select the chair and vice 16 chair who shall not be employees of the state and may serve 17 as chair and vice chair for up to two consecutive years. The 18 council shall hold its first meeting no later than thirty 19 20 days after the appointment of all eleven voting members and at least once every quarter after the initial meeting. For 21 purposes of the initial meeting, the secretary of aging and 22 long-term services or the secretary's designee shall call and 23 preside over the meeting until a chair is selected. 24

E. A majority of the voting members shall HB 471

1 constitute a quorum of the Alzheimer's disease and other 2 dementia advisory council. 3 SECTION 2. DUTIES -- REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.--Α. The Alzheimer's disease and other dementia 4 5 advisory council shall study the: 6 (1) needs of individuals living with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; 7 8 (2) services available in the state for individuals with Alzheimer's disease and other dementia or 9 their familial caregivers; and 10 ability of health care providers and 11 (3) facilities to meet the current and future needs of 12 individuals with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia. 13 The Alzheimer's disease and other dementia Β. 14 15 advisory council shall create an Alzheimer's disease and 16 other dementia state plan that recommends strategies to improve Alzheimer's disease and other dementia care in New 17 The council shall submit the state plan to the Mexico. 18 legislative health and human services committee, the 19 20 legislative finance committee and the office of the governor no later than July 1, 2026, and an updated state plan shall 21 be submitted every four years after that. When creating or 22 updating the state plan, the council shall consider and make 23 findings and recommendations on: 24 25 (1) trends relating to the state's

1 populations of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and other 2 dementia, including the: 3 state's role in providing or (a) 4 facilitating long-term care, familial caregiver support and 5 assistance to those with early-stage or early-onset Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; 6 state's policies regarding 7 (b) 8 individuals with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; fiscal impact of Alzheimer's 9 (c) 10 disease and other dementia; (d) establishment of systems to better 11 determine the number of individuals diagnosed with 12 Alzheimer's disease or other dementia in the state; 13 (e) workforce of health care workers 14 15 who are able to serve people with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia, including neurologists and direct care 16 workers; 17 availability and cost of various (f) 18 forms of dementia care services; and 19 20 (g) availability of home- and community-based services for individuals diagnosed with 21 Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; and 22 (2) policies and strategies relating to: 23 increasing public awareness of 24 (a) Alzheimer's disease and other dementia; 25 HB 471 Page 5

18	C. The Alzheimer's disease and other dementia			
19	advisory council shall monitor the progress of the			
20	implementation of the Alzheimer's disease and other dementia			
21	state plan recommendations. The council shall submit an			
22	annual report to the legislative health and human services			
23	committee, the legislative finance committee and the office of			
24	the governor on the status of the implementation of the state
