8	care demand is growing at an unprecedented pace; and	
9	WHEREAS, for the twentieth consecutive year, nurses have	
10	ranked as the most honest and ethical profession, according	
11	to a Gallup poll; and	
12	WHEREAS, the compassion, resolve and positive impact of	
13	nurses over the past few years cannot be overstated; and	
14	WHEREAS, from risking their lives as frontline health	
15	care professionals during the coronavirus disease 2019	
16	pandemic to working longer shifts to meet patient demand,	
17	nurses have more than earned their reputation as the most	
18	trusted profession; and	
19	WHEREAS, there will be a nationwide nursing shortage due	
20	to nurse retirements and an increase in demand for services,	
21	and New Mexico has one of the lowest nurse-to-population	
22	ratios in the country, with approximately seventeen thousand	
23	registered nurses; and	
24	WHEREAS, to address the shortfall, New Mexico	
25	institutions of higher education are focusing on the	HM

WHEREAS, the nursing workforce is considered the top occupation in job growth, with New Mexico's nursing workforce expected to increase over the next four years by approximately eleven percent; and

WHEREAS, the majority of nurses are employed by hospitals, where they face increased complexities of patients' medical issues; and

WHEREAS, a variety of roles have emerged within nursing, such as nurse consultant, nurse informatics specialist, researcher, executive, facility nurse, home health care provider and case manager for chronic illnesses; and 13

WHEREAS, nurses work in a variety of settings, including 14 long-term care facilities, homes, correctional facilities, 15 schools, occupational settings, insurance companies and 16 regulatory entities; and 17

WHEREAS, advanced practice nurses, such as nurse 18 practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified nurse-19 midwives and certified registered nurse anesthetists, fill 20 the gap in access to health care and provide quality, safe 21 and effective care throughout New Mexico; and 22

WHEREAS, the nursing community is appreciative of the legislative support it has received to promote adequate staffing of the nursing workforce and for various nursing
