11	WHEREAS, each year, soil and water conservation	
12	districts work with leaders in agriculture, environment,	
13	education and other industries to drive voluntary,	
14	incentive-driven programs that benefit everyone; and	
15	WHEREAS, nearly three thousand such districts nationwide	
16	assist in stewardship responsibilities and ensure that the	
17	work of conservation is maintained at the local level; and	
18	WHEREAS, New Mexico's forty-seven soil and water	
19	conservation districts amplify the common voice of federal,	
20	state and local governments, tribes and more than ten	
21	thousand farmers and ranchers that are the stewards of more	
22	than seventy-seven million acres of forest, range, cropland,	
23	pasture and other lands in the state; and	
24	WHEREAS, since 1946, New Mexico's soil and water	
25	conservation districts have successfully executed the	SM 40
