SUMMARY

Synopsis of House Bill 87

House Bill 87 (HB87) would remove volunteer fire departments and volunteer emergency medical technician service providers from the definition of "public body" in the New Mexico Civil Rights Act (NMCRA).

This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect June 16, 2023, (90 days after the Legislature adjourns) if signed into law.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications for HB87.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB87 would amend Section 41-4A-2 NMSA 1978 such that the impacted entities and their employees could not be sued under the NMCRA for depriving New Mexico residents of any rights, privileges, or immunities secured by the New Mexico Constitution.
