SUMMARY

Synopsis of Senate Bill 419

Senate Bill 419 appropriates \$300 thousand from the general fund to the state Aging and Long-Term Services Department for the purpose of implementing a program of all-inclusive care for the elderly at two adult daycare sites. This bill does not contain an effective date and, as a result, would go into effect June 16, 2023, (90 days after the Legislature adjourns) if signed into law.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Aging and Long-Term Services Department reports the appropriation in Senate Bill 419 would allow for an expansion of services in FY24. The appropriation of \$300 thousand contained in Senate Bill 419 is associated with an on-going program and therefore is considered a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY24 from the appropriation would revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Aging and Long-Term Services Department notes:

All-inclusive programs at Adult Day Care Centers (ADCs) allow individuals to live as long as possible in their homes and communities, contributing to a higher quality of life. These centers were originally developed to decrease older adults' physical and cognitive decline and prevent isolation and depression.
