14	WHEREAS, nurses play a critical role in health care
15	delivery; and
16	WHEREAS, with an aging United States population, health
17	care demand is growing at an unprecedented pace; and
18	WHEREAS, for the twentieth consecutive year, nurses have
19	ranked as the most honest and ethical profession, according to
20	a Gallup poll; and
21	WHEREAS, the compassion, resolve and positive impact of
22	nurses over the past few years cannot be overstated; and
23	WHEREAS, from risking their lives as frontline health care
24	professionals during the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic to
25	working longer shifts to meet patient demand, nurses have more

WHEREAS, there will be a nationwide nursing shortage due to nurse retirements and an increase in demand for services, and New Mexico has one of the lowest nurse-to-population ratios in the country, with approximately seventeen thousand registered nurses; and

8 WHEREAS, to address the shortfall, New Mexico institutions
9 of higher education are focusing on the expansion of
10 accelerated nursing programs and the retention of nurses in the
11 workforce; and

WHEREAS, the nursing workforce is considered the top occupation in job growth, with New Mexico's nursing workforce expected to increase over the next four years by approximately eleven percent; and

WHEREAS, the majority of nurses are employed by hospitals, where they face increased complexities of patients' medical issues; and

WHEREAS, a variety of roles have emerged within nursing, such as nurse consultant, nurse informatics specialist, researcher, executive, facility nurse, home health care provider and case manager for chronic illnesses; and

WHEREAS, nurses work in a variety of settings, including long-term care facilities, homes, correctional facilities, schools, occupational settings, insurance companies and .223926.1
