A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT TO RESTRICT THE TERM "LATINX" AND SIMILAR TERMS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND POST-SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AS AN ALL-ENCOMPASSING TERM IN REFERENCE TO PEOPLE OF HISPANIC DESCENT.

WHEREAS, the term "Latinx" or "LatinX" has emerged as a pan-ethnic term for the words "Latino/Latina" and "Hispanic"; and

WHEREAS, the Spanish language has existed for more than one thousand five hundred years and traditionally consists of grammar using masculine and feminine constructs; and

WHEREAS, the term "Latinx" or "LatinX" is inappropriate within the masculine and feminine constructs of the Spanish language, and its use therefore disrespects and disregards the .222863.5

"gender-neutral" term;

historical and cultural context of the Spanish language; and

WHEREAS, approximately only three percent of Hispanics use
the term; and

WHEREAS, the term "Hispanic" is an appropriate

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the public education department and the higher education department be requested to restrict the term "Latinx" or "LatinX" in public schools and post-secondary educational institutions as an all-encompassing term in reference to people of Hispanic descent; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public education department be requested to prohibit the use or purchase of any instructional materials for use within a public school classroom using the term "Latinx" or "LatinX" as an all-encompassing term in reference to people of Hispanic descent; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature commit to preserving the Spanish language in its natural and unaltered form; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of public education, the secretary of higher education, the secretary of cultural affairs, the presidents of all post-secondary educational institutions in .222863.5
