23	WHEREAS, Tara Hughes is the first pre-kindergarten teacher
24	to be recognized as the New Mexico teacher of the year; and
25	WHEREAS, 2023 teacher of the year Tara Hughes has

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WHEREAS, Tara Hughes' parents, Patricia and Kenny Hughes, and her husband, Joshua Johns, were integral to Tara's success and deserve special honors; and
