BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the vision zero plan be requested to achieve an annual traffic safety record with zero vehicle-related deaths or serious injuries by the end of calendar year 2030; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the vision zero plan be requested to include recommendations for amendments to the Motor Vehicle Code or other laws in order to achieve the vision zero goals and an evaluation framework that measures the effectiveness of vision zero efforts, including transportation projects intended to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the vision zero plan be requested to consider the creation of a position of "vision zero coordinator" within the department of transportation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on or before October 31, 2023, the secretary of transportation report on the status of the vision zero plan to the appropriate interim legislative committee concerning transportation, the legislative finance committee and the governor; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of transportation, the chair of the legislative finance committee and the governor.

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
