#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 19 creates two new crimes related to election offenses: disrupting election results and falsely acting as a presidential elector. Both carry the penalty of a third degree felony.

Disrupting election results consists of knowingly or recklessly:

- Suppressing, defacing, altering, forging, or making false entries in a county or state canvass report, certificate of election, or certificate of ascertainment of appointment of electors or
- Preparing or submitting a false canvass report, certificate of canvass or election or certificate of ascertainment of appointment of electors.

Falsely acting as a presidential elector consists of knowingly or recklessly making a false representation to an election official or in an election document that the person is an elected presidential elector for the state. It is not a defense that the representation is made with a qualification that the person's status as an elected presidential elector is conditional upon the occurrence of a future event.

The Attorney General or a district attorney may bring an action in the name of the state to enforce either provision.
